In this connection we call attention to a letter furnished to The Graphic last February, but not printed until to-day. We could not publish it then, for the same reason that Grant himself did not expel Bristow from the Cabinet.

The public mind was in no temper to listen to reason. The public feeling had been so skillfully manipulated that the truth regarding Bristow would not have received any attention.

But we give it now, and we ask the reader to persevere in the light of subsequent revelations. It will now receive more attention, for the public is in a more judicial and perceptive mood.

The simple truth about Mr. Bristow is that he is a self-seeking and crafty politician. His going before congressional committees, and by implication hinting that there was something that official etiquette compelled him to conceal, was so censurable, if the hint had not been of fact, that it is difficult to find words in which to properly characterize it.
