DOMESTIC.

NOON DISPATCHES.

Galveston, Aug 2—Gold 110 @ 111. New York, Aug 2—Gold opened 111.

Washington, August 2—The House is again filibustering over the silver bill. This bill authorizes the issue of coin certificates for bullion, receivable for all public debts except when gold coin is specified, and the coinage standard for silver dollars to be legal tender for any amount.

The Republican Senators are caucusing. The presiding officer of the Senate has appointed Hon. Sargent and Cooper members on the part of the Senate of the Joint committee, authorizing them to proceed to California during the recess to inquire into the subject of Chinese immigration.

San Francisco, August 2—The six hundred points—Ernest Casan game of billiards between Sexton and Daley, last night, was won by Sexton by 77 points on the thirty-first inning. The greatest runs were Sexton 119, Daley 184. Average, Sexton 19 1/2-12, Daley 17 3/4-14.

FOREIGN.

NOON DISPATCHES.

London, August 2—In the House of Commons John O'Connor Powers moved for an opinion of the House that the time had come for pardoning the Fenians. After debate it was rejected by 117 to 151.

A dispatch from Zava yesterday states that Moshar Pacha was slightly wounded in the last battle, and withdrew from Belak, going in the direction of Trebinge to await reinforcement.

A detachment of 6000 Serbians left Belak on Monday at 10 o'clock for the Montenegrins, where upon Moshar Pacha retired and an engagement followed. At last accounts the result of this fight is unknown.

London, August 2—The Standard's Berlin dispatch says the information of Sultan Murad's deposition has not been officially communicated to the European Powers. There is no doubt that Turkey stands in the presence of another crisis.

St. Petersburg, August 2—The Herald's dispatch declares that the Christians in Turkey are in a deplorable condition, and require immediate support, which Europe is able to grant if she is in earnest.

The report that Marshal Rasinzo had entered the Turkish service is not true. He remains in Spain. ENGLAND'S ARBITRATOR. The Standard's Paris correspondence telegraphs that Austria has agreed to select England as an arbiter in the Slavonic conflict between Turkey and Serbia.

The situation of the Servians is considered to have improved during the past few days. The Bozraglians of Rome have a report that an insurrection has broken out in Albania, with headquarters at Sentari, and that the movement is spreading throughout the provinces.

A special to the Standard dated Granada, July 29, reports that the Turks under Ahmed Kuyulu Pacha entered the northern extremity of which was closed by a mountain, where the Servians had a redoubt. Every house in Granada was fortified. After a cannonade of an hour's duration the Turks climbed the mountain and carried the redoubt by storm. The Servians fled and Granada and Darbint are in ruins.

On the Frozen mountains behind Derbit the Servians made a stand, but again retired. It is reported that on Sunday the Turks were within two miles of Krutzowitz.

Vienna, August 2—A special to the Daily News gives a report that the Emperor of Russia has addressed the Turkish Ambassador at St. Petersburg as follows: "The atrocities in Bulgaria have deprived Turkey of the sympathy of Europe. I shall set in a friendly manner towards Turkey if she treats the Christians tenderly."

Between the twenty-third and thirty-first of July five Turkish divisions entered Serbia. The Servians are seeking to avoid a battle. The Times' Vienna special reports that Sultan Pacha attacked the Servians at Pondovitz. The position was defended by eight battalions and twelve guns. The Servians were dislodged.

The Turkish columns have united before Kujarsitz which place has been fortified by the Servians. FRENCH DUEL. Paris, August 2—A bloodless duel was fought on yesterday near the Belgian frontier between two Deputies, M Ducloux and M Ornon. The weapons used were pistols.

London, August 2—Mr John Henry Patterson, M.P., a member of the banking house of McCullough & Co, has resigned his interest in that firm. Mr Mortimer Collins, the poet novelist, died on the 29th of July. He remains were buried yesterday in Fifehead St. George's church.

Washington, August 2—House—The silver bill was filibustered over to tomorrow. Impeachment managers reported the result of their work to the House. The House went into a Committee of the whole.
