The spring wheat growing Statos have given us some discouraging reports, but they have in many, if not in all instances, proved to be exaggerations, and it is not improbable that a full crop and in many places entirely over, is not improbable that a full crop will be barvested. Fall barley has been harvested, and turns out well. Spring barley in the Northwest gives fair promise to a tull crop, Rye and oats are abundant everywhere. Corn is growing rapidly, and continues the fair promise of the largest yield in the history of the century.
