At the close of the year 1875 there were in France 2,882,600 horses, 299,000 mules, 450,000 asses, 11,284,000 oxen, 24,707,000 shrep. 5,337,000 pign, and 1,791,000 goals. The total value of these demestic asi mals was estimated at about four milliards of france. The principal part of the export trade in eattle from France is with Great Britain, and its importance may be obtained from the Trade Navigation Returns, published by the British Government. During the year 1875 Great Britain imported 173, 705 exen, 51,264 cows, 38,729 calves, 977,883 sheep, and 71,928 swine. The total value of these imports amounted to £7,330,240.
