We know of no more grateful thought for consideration in the columns of Sauday Mornings Express than the one suggested by the fact that the present year is the merican Year of Jubilee both in a political and a material sense. The yield of barley is also very great, and there will be 210,000 tons, or nearly 10,-000,000 bushels for export. Texas is fully as fortunate as California in her cereal srops. In the West and North-West we find in the winter-wheat-growing sections sipated, for where only one fourth to one half an average crop was expected it has seldom proved to be less than one half, and from that up to a full average.

The spring-wheat-growing States have given us some discouraging reports, but they have in many, if not all, instances proved exaggerations, and it is not impos-sible that a full crop will be harvested. Fall barley has been harvested, and turns out wall. Spring barley in the Northwest gives fair promises of a full crop. Rye and onte are abundant everywhere. Corn is growing rapidly, and continues the fair premise of the largest yield in the history

Turning even to Europe, we find that as the harvest approaches the creaking becomes silent—the damage caused by storms and unfavorable weather earlier in the season, especially in France and Holland, have not proved to be permanent, and cereal crops at the latest mail dates were in a more promising condition. In the south of Russia the wheat barvest had already commenced. The only really pn-fortunate reports come from Hungary, and even in that country there had been a change for the better.
