GOV. COKE VS. LAW AND ORDER.

We referred a few days ago to the threatened danger of military intervention in Texas, a consequence upon the non-observance of which Governor Coke is confident. Yes, His Excellency has persistently refused to lend aid to the suppression of crime in Texas, to the great detriment of the interests of our State, and to his personal condemnation.

THE GAZETTE OF THE STATE, is capable and extensive editorial touting the responsibility of the Executive for the existence of crime and lawlessness, says, that coming to review, in the maturity of experience, the Governor, seated in consultation with crime and lawlessness, we find these are dreadful little evidences that he brought to his office the right qualities of a right-minded, resolute, practical and veritable statesman.

WE DO NOT SAY THAT GOV. COKE'S derelictions solely is due the fearful progress of crime and lawlessness during his administration. Legislative fecklessness must be charged with much of the blame. But we do say that as chief magistrate of the State, possessing by reason of peculiar circumstances an unequalled prestige, and an extraordinary influence over legislation, Governor Coke is principally responsible for the deplorable fact that during his administration lawlessness and crime have not been suppressed, but rather aggravated and emboldened.

MORE SYMPATHY.
The Houston Telegraph, in a pleasant editorial, referring to the recent recital of grievances of Western Texas, submitted at the Congressional Convention, pertinently remarks:

"OUR FELLOW CITIZENS HAVE GOOD grounds for desiring a change in the condition of their affairs, and we believe that a faithful and careful inquiry into the causes of their troubles will also betray the after-fulfillment of their occasion or separation, and establishment as an independent State, to remove the evils of which they justly complain.

THE TELEGRAPH DAILY brings us information regarding the Turco Servian war, but these reports are just about as conflicting as they could well be. One day we hear of a complete "wipe out" of the Turks, while the next day brings us intelligence that it was the Servians who were annihilated.
