Section 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas that it shall be the duty of the Commission...

Section 2. It shall be the duty of such court at its first session after the filing of such petition with the Clerk thereof, to order an election to be held at the regular voting place or places within the proposed precinct...
