

WATER WORKS FOR SAN ANTONIO. days of the heathen nations of the world,

Our felloweit zen, J. B. Lacos'e, Esq. has been for some weeks engaged in framing a proposition to the city to construct water works. We have not men-tioned the matter heretofore for the sim-ple reason that it was a private enterprise, and until submitted to the public by its inaugurator, was not ours to dea with. Mr. Lacoute has authorized us to publish the following substance of his roposition : -The proposed water-works would start with a pipage system, extending over an

area of nine and one-fourth miles, se die tributed as to place the entire business portion of the city under fire protection and in this line of distribution will be placed the Fire Hydrante. For the use of these hydrants, it is asked that the City pay an annual sum of \$125 each for the dret year, \$100 for the second, and \$80 for the third. In case the city needs more-in future than three hundred, then such frice as may be agreed upon, not to exsed, however, the last named sum of \$90, the rent not to begin until the parties are ready to supply water, and then only as the hydrauts are creeted and ready for use. They further agree to furnish water free of charge for washing and flush ing the gutters, sprinkle streets and plasas, filling fire ; cisterus, for all purpose of the Fire Department, and for supplying such public four tains as the city may establish. They guarantee that the alld works shall be of the most durable ma terial and first class in every respect, and capable of supplying to each individual at least 75 gallons of water per day, with sufficient pressure to raise the water to the highest buildings in the city, and capable, in case of fire, of throwing six streams from as many hydrants at one time, through fifty feet of two and a half inches hose, and one inch nozzle, to the height of the highest building that may he erected in the city, the works to be commenced within 90 days and completed within one year after a railroad reaches this city-except the reservoir, which must be completed within three years, and shall have the capacity of at least 3,000,000 of gallous. The rate to private consumers shall never exceed 6c. per hundeed gallone. For the public supply the city is to untar into a contract for a period of twenty five years at the end of that time the city shall have the right to purcham the works at an appraised value The city to sell or lease the property heretofore set aside by the city for the purpose of water works, on which to erect the necessary buildings and hydraulic ma-
