She is deprets of those uncomly sights and acts of bullyism that o often characterize the frontier town Society is of the bighest order here, and the comforts and refinements of the large and centrally located cities of the country are as common as could be expected. San Antonio bears the distinction of a quiet and orderly city—in other words, she has a good character and a good reputation.

The proper time to collect evidence as Then is the prowler's season of delight, for like the owl. he comes out when darkness covers the earth. Night is the time when all manner of deviltries go on, and it is therefore the proper time to estimate people within a city.

A noisy aight is a rare thing in San Anonio. By nine o'clock each evening, the marts of trade are almost all closed, and the day's busy hours arounded. The li quor houses, the restaurants, the hotels and the Express printing office, we believe, are the only institutions which pretend to keep late hours. About these places, there is seldom any disturbance of the harmonious run of things, and if it Enquire at this office. were not for the clattering of hacks, one would fain come to the conclusion, along about midnight, that ours was a deserted city. We find cause for this quietude in that almost every person in San Antonio has something to occupy him. There is a truly spoken proverb that "Satan finds mischief for idle hands to do," but as there are no idle hands here, his Satanic Majes ty has no material to work with. Almost every person within the city has some thing to do-some permanent location in business,- and, best of all, a home to ever before return to when the day's labor is ended. This is the great point of difference between ours and most other cuties. We have no railroad yet to flood our quiet city with the transient, roving and unprofitable moonshine revelers, which nake night hideous with their noises, but only such as can work and behave themselves find welcome here.

It is true, the variety theatres creat ome bustle in their neighborhoods, but their proprietors conduct them in a proper manner, and it is only now and then when some ungovernable cuss comes along that any unseemly conduct is enact about them. Occasionally, a midnight bummer is met in the streets too "full" to handle himself with a natural grace, but few of the drinking men who come this way are of the shouting and quarreling reckless fellow "takes in" our city in his

About one Colock each night, when ad the bars and varieties have closed their doors and darkened their windows, the butchers begin to repair to their respec tive stalls in the markets to prepare their ments for the morning custom. In pass sing the markets between the hours of one and four a., m., all is found to be ac tivity. The ding of the butchers' axes, as it into amaller many sawa; the cheerful whistle and the jolly laugh, render the mart of steaks and roasts and tenderloins quite an interesting sight to gaze upon. About 4 p. m. market-goers begin to arrive, and activity increases until the gray eastern horizon is brightened by the appearance of the aun.

We have mentioned the Expanss office as one of the places of business which never closes its doors. Day in day out, some one can be found at gur affice. Our lights burn from duck until broad daylight. At evening, a boy trims the lamps, lights them and places them in their po sitions, where they burn for the types who return to their cases after supper. The late local news of the day is written up and composed for the morning paper; the State journals which arrive by the evening's mail are searched for the latest State news, and this is also furnished the reader next morning; then the late press dispatches come in, and they, too, are soon transmitted in type to the columns of the morning issue. When all the news obtainable is in type, which labor ends the hour of midnight, the printers retire, and the foreman remains to lock the forms, which are then turned over to the pressman. About half-past, three the edition is run through the press, and a half-dozen newsboys, and so many carriors, are on hand, to do their respective duties of feeding, folding and mailing the papers. It is now half-past four o'clock, and the carriers depart on their missions of delivery, and presently out dart the newsboys, scattering, each to his allotted section of the city, the lively echo of "Here's your Morning Expanse" ringing on the air.
