A WISE ACTION.

The neglected State has at once become the centre of all eyes, and the nation gazes interestedly upon the developments to take place at the Crescent City within the next three days.

The citizens of New Orleans had urgently requested Mr. Hewitt to appoint a delegation of prominent gentlemen to come to their city, to counsel for peace and an honest return.

IN FRONT OF THE HERALD OFFICE

The New York Herald thus describes the scene in front of its office the night succeeding the election. It shows the great interest which was taken in the election. Imagine, 10,000 people standing in the cold rain to learn the result of the day's voting.

An extraordinary scene was witnessed outside the office in the evening. The rain, which fell upon the just and unjust alike, fell steadily for hours upon a mass of human beings numbering perhaps 10,000 persons. The great majority was uncovered, that is, no umbrellas shielded them from the steady downpour.

It must have been a democratic gathering, for they cheered with a vim every announcement of democratic gain as they appeared in rapid succession on the Herald's bulletin board. The street in fact was impassable, and the people extended down Vesey and Ann streets in solid array.

For half a century to come there will never be seen such an exhibition of popular interest as was shown last night in front of the Herald. The calcium light and the figures as they appeared every moment in dress and sheep's wool.

It was just a quarter before seven o'clock when the first returns were posted. They came from the Twenty-fourth ward of this city and recorded a vote of 1,277 for Tilden, 762 in favor of Hayes and 7 who were willing to stand sponsors for the rag handling.

At last it was made known that New Hampshire—the first State heard from—gave Hayes a majority of 5,500. The result was met by groans and not cries by the Tildenites. News was heard the voice of South Carolina, which said that she had polled a tremendous vote for Wade Hampton, whom she chose to rule her destinies during the next gubernatorial term.

At a quarter to eleven o'clock it was known that Tilden had carried the city by a majority of more than 24,000, and that the State was claimed for him by 49,000. Up to a few hours before the people had been divided together in the rain, cheering or groaning according to their liking or otherwise, the returns from different parts of the country as they continued to pour in.

CONFIDENT DEMOCRATS.

The Louisiana Democrats are confident that their majority is great enough to elect their ticket after throwing out both the Yelland and Nicholls, East Baton Rouge, Ouachita and Morehouse parishes, where their majorities are 4500, by a majority of upwards of 20000. They say that there is an uncontestable power that can defeat the resolution of the country to have a fair count, which will solve the problem in their favor.

"Sufficient returns have been received, and from sufficiently reliable sources, to show beyond question that Nicholls and Tilden have a majority of the votes now in the ballot-box of the State—barring theft or destruction of boxes. Republicans concede a majority, and as Mr. Packard has stated that he would not attempt to throw out the vote of the alleged 'uncontested' parishes, the only thing left for his party to do is to admit the election of Nicholls.

This was a precautionary action on the part of the Democrats to avoid a political quarrel which, under the peculiar circumstances, might have endangered the very existence of constitutional government, and involved this country in another civil war.
