AMERICAN GIRLS.

HOW THEY HAVE BEEN JILTED BY TITLED FOREIGNERS—ROSE BERRY, THE ENGLISH FLIRT.

[From the Hartford Times.] The notice of the arrival at New York of Earl Roseberry reminds me of the number of American girls who have been jilted by foreigners on account of their lack of fortune. Settlements always form so prominent a part of marriage in the old countries that these foreigners attempt the same stipulations in the United States. Last winter the daughter of W. B. Dunce, of New York, visited Miss Edith Fish, and was frequently seen in society, where she ranked among the belles. Prior to the failure of the banking firm of Dunce, Sherman & Co., this young lady's engagement to the Earl of Roseberry was announced and last winter she was looked upon as his fiancee. He is now the husband of the wealthy Miss Rothschild. There are more than one of the fair belles of this city who have been similarly treated. One young lady even went so far as to change her religion in order to remove what the family called an objection. Her lover departed with the promise of returning. She has never seen him since, but shortly after his arrival in France he wrote to announce his marriage to a lady whom his father had selected for him on account of the dowry she brought. Six years ago Count Targone, one of the attaches of the French legation, plighted his troth to a beautiful girl in Georgetown. The Count met with an accident in his childhood that has dwarfed his proportions and produced a lameness from which he will never recover. Notwithstanding these defects, the young lady preferred him to all other suitors. The Count's father refused his sanction to a marriage without the necessary settlement being made. This the young lady's father could not do, without impoverishing his large family; and, much as they would like to be allied to the great house of Targone, they are not disposed to make so great a sacrifice. The Count was so jealous of his wife he frothed that while he was here he would not permit her to see any company, even with her sister, in her mother's parlor. When he returns to Europe, five years ago, he had the same injunction upon her. She has been a recluse all this time, while he enjoys society in Paris and Rome. Every six months it is announced that the marriage is to take place, but "He comes not," she cries. Perhaps he is waiting for his father's death. Most people believe that he is inconstant, and that he no longer desires his father's consent. His letters and presents continue to arrive, and it may be a case of true love, but, if all is true that is said of such alliances, the deserted girls are the most fortunate. It is alleged that these foreign gentlemen rule their wives, and speak to them very roughly. That don't suit our free-spoken, independent girls. They are educated to believe themselves the equals of any man, and if there is to be any yielding it must come from the husband. They expect to be treated with deference and respect, and it is said that the most fruitful source of trouble is the children. The mother wishes to care for them herself, as do all good American mothers; but these foreigners don't like any such trouble, and so they consign to the nurses the care of these little ones, and deny the mother's right to interfere. When the children are old enough to be educated the difference of opinion is greater, and gives rise to coolness and indifference between husband and wife. A SOCIOLOGICAL PROBLEM.

[From the Philadelphia Bulletin.] A correspondent writes to us thus: A recent number of a scientific journal, speaking of the relative proportion of the sexes in the human race, declares that for every 100 men that came into the world 100 72-100 women are born. I do not dispute these figures. I only ask for light. It appears according to this that there are some women who are only 75-100 of a woman. What the remaining 28-100 are I cannot imagine. Now what I know is this: If a woman of this kind marries 100 men and has a daughter, will the daughter be an 84-100 woman or a 96-100 woman? And what will be the exact relationship between such a daughter and a 70-100 man and her 87-100 daughters, especially if the 87-100 girls marry the brothers or the 96-100 girls and so become not only her 98-100 first cousins, but 85-100 sisters-in-law, the aforesaid 95-100 mother-in-law or her 88-100 nephews, will the—the—the— Let me see; where am I? It is an awful subject to tackle. Oh, yes! I say if the 70-100 aunt— But, no; the question can't be solved in any such way as this. I give it up. The only way to get at it will be to do the sum in algebra somehow, making the daughter x, the aunt y, the first cousin z, and the mother-in-law w. Then, it seems to me, if you multiply the aunt by the daughter, and divide the first cousin by the mother-in-law, in some way or other, or extract the square root of the cousins and subtract the result from the aunt, keeping the daughter as a common denominator, and at the same time making a decimal fraction of the mother-in-law, perhaps the result might be satisfactory. But I am not certain. I am poor at mathematics. I wish the lightning-calculator would get at this, or that Prof. Tyndall would subject it to chemical analysis.

FORMER TURKISH WARS.

[From the Pall Mall Gazette.] In reference to Russian proposals "to settle the Eastern question in concert with the English fleet," it may be worth noting that the English fleet has already been employed three, if not four times, in furthering what were then supposed to be the joint interests of Great Britain and the Czar. In 1770 the British and Russian combined squadrons defeated the Turkish fleet in the Channel of Sicily. In December, 1806, England and Russia declared war against Turkey, which was accused of arbitrarily interfering in the domestic affairs of Moldavia and Wallachia, in violation of existing treaties. Singularly enough, the Government of the Porte preferred exactly the same complaint against the Government of the Emperor Alexander. Who was in the right it may be difficult to say. Apparently Lord Howick (afterward Lord Grey), then at the head of the Foreign Office, considered that justice or English interests were on the side of the Czar. During this war, however, Russians and English did not literally fight side by side, but England sent a squadron under Sir John Duckworth to take Constantinople. The passage of the Dardanelles was achieved on the 19th of February, 1807; but the Admiral was obliged to retrace them on the 2d of March, re-entrance, and with heavy loss, the castles of Scutari and Abydos hurled down the sides of many tons weight upon the British ships. It would be interesting to know whether the most modern iron-clad could resist this primitive, but formidable kind of artillery. On the 20th of October, 1827, Sir Edward Codrington did good work in the Bay of Navarino, in furtherance of Russian schemes; and it has been thought by some that the late Sir Charles Napier's brilliant successes on the Syrian and Egyptian coast did more to promote the ends of Muscovite than of British policy. At all events, it was not Russia but France that was jilted by the famous treaty of the 15th of July, 1840.

RUSSIA'S POLICY FORECAST.

A correspondent of the London Standard calls attention to a pamphlet entitled "Peter the Great's Last Will and Testament," in which he considers the following passage throws some light upon the present policy of Russia. Rule 11 of the will reads as follows: "We must make the house of Austria interested in the expulsion of the Turks from Europe, and we must neutralize its jealousy at the capture of Constantinople either by procuring it with a war with the old European States or by allowing it a share of the spoil, which we afterwards resume at our leisure." Upon which the author of the pamphlet remarks: "From the present Eastern war, the empires of Russia and Austria have been working together—Austria's part being the boundary of the Danube, and Hungary and Italy on one side, and during the last four years, have been used by Russia as a lever for Austrian co-operation in the designs of her more powerful neighbor and willing ally."
