NEW ORLEANS, Dec. 26.—St. James, Hayes and Joyce of the House and Committee returned to-day from Baton Rouge to attend a meeting of the full committee to-morrow.
In reply to Mr. Orton's dispatch to Mr. Morrison stating that he would not be present in New Orleans in obedience to the subpoena, Mr. Morrison says he will communicate the fact to the House, and that it is his belief these facts and others disclosed in the testimony of Mr. Barnes, telegraphic manager at New Orleans, and Mr. Orton's, former communications, showed a purpose on the part of the returning board to obstruct the investigation which the House might regard in contempt of its authority.
The concession to the Justice is abandoned on account of bad weather.
THE CASE OF OROON'S CAPTAIN.
New York, Dec. 26.—A dispatch dated Camp North Fork of Bellefonte, December 21, says:
Gen. Crook announced at a council with our Indian scouts here, that the expedition was to start tomorrow in the morning. We have rations for twelve days and half forage for a week. Neither the Indians sent to locate Crazy Horse's village, nor those sent to Red Cloud to bring out more Indian soldiers, have joined us yet, and our present meagre stock of supplies, with the limited amount of transportation at the posts which are ordered to assist us, is not nearly a further preparation of the present campaign.
Three or four hundred Indians, some of them of the Big Horn, and some of the bands of Indian braves have been wandering about the country in our vicinity and carrying a war on our movements, a fact which tends to make the capture of the hostile Indians by our troops a matter of serious difficulty, if not impossible, even if our stock were in better condition, and supplies for the men and animals more plentiful. We are about four days' march from Fort Reno, and shall probably be back at Ft. Vetterman about the 31st inst.

LOS OF LIFE.
London, Dec. 26.—At least one hundred lives were lost on Friday and Saturday off the north coast of Scotland. The total loss there within a fortnight is 250 men and two vessels.
MARQUESS OF SALISBURY.

DOMESTIC.
MIDNIGHT DISPATCHES.
NEW ORLEANS, Dec. 26.—Gov. Patton, Chairman of the Democratic State Committee, testified as follows:
He said it had been the universal custom of the committee to urge upon the members of the party the supreme importance of preserving peace at the sacrifice of everything. He said the defense was satisfied in a fair, free and peaceable election could carry the State, but knew nothing of the conduct of the campaign in Ochsler's, except from the reports of the registration of the State, though I thought was conducted by the Hon. Michael Hahn, Chief Supervisor, who was a Republican supervisor, was represented by S. H. Jones, an Anglo who was acting as Governor. They were Republicans as far as the witness knew. In many cases they were residents of other parishes, and had requested Gov. Antoine to let us have a fair representation in the registration. Antoine said he had appointed some Democrats, but declined to do so at the request of the witness. When a letter asking for division of the registration was handed Antoine, he saw no justice in it, and would have to submit it to the committee. He afterwards wrote a letter declining to do so. The witness promised to furnish copies of the entire correspondence, which will be incorporated in the report to the Senate.
The Democratic campaign of the State organized by a central committee, a long duty it is to conduct the campaign on the principles announced by the convention. No specific instructions are given by the convention. From the testimony from the parishes of the State, he recently visited the headquarters of the State Committee. Some few parishes sent by New Orleans representatives to the State Committee. Representatives from nearly every parish visited the committee, and were urged upon them the line of conduct adopted and published during the campaign in newspapers, and urged upon them the importance of a peaceful election, aside from humanitarian principles, involved as a matter of policy. He knew that the statements had been made of lawlessness, heresies, and the necessity of peace and unanimity, but had no special apprehension or information that any acts of violence would be committed. He apprehended that in the heated campaign collisions might occur, and was under the impression that it was the desire of the republican party to bring about such a collision. He thought the election of the democratic State ticket, if elected, would be conducted by the returning board, and unless the national democracy was successful, every disturbance that occurred in connection with the personal or other party would be abandoned by the republican party, and democratic party, and therefore we are anxious that there should be no disturbance of any kind of violence, and every party should use every means of peace and the polls thrown out by the returning board.
