fourth or starch. POINTS OF INTEREST IN THE REVEN-UE SERVICE.

The dispute into which we have been drawn in connection with revenue matters in this city, induces us to publish certain points of general interest regarding the instructions given revenue officers, the abstement of taxes, etc. These points may prove raluable knowledge to dealers in figures and tobacces.

Regarding uncollectable taxes, the abate ment of a tax on the ground of its being ancellectible does not relieve the taxpayer of his liablity thereto, and the collector is instructed to exercise diligence to collect the same at subsequent periods.

He chould of tax-payer to this remedy by claim on Form 46.

"In the adjustment of their accounts sollectors will be credited with all taxes proved to be uncollectible on account of having been erroneously or illegally as sessed. They will also be credited with those which though properly and legally assessed, are shown to be uncollectible by reason of the insolvency or absconding of the parties from which the taxes are owing, prosided it shall also be shown that due diligence has been shown in making demand, and in endeavoring to enforce payment.

"Collectors are required to make demand within the time prescribed by law, and either to collect the taxes, or prove them to be uncollectible, within six weeks after the receipt of the list, unless special reasone are furnished, such as lack of mail tacilities, great extent of territory, &c.,

showing why they could not be collected within that time." The above we judge to be the rules which principally governed the revenue officers in their recent action in this city.



ARCHITECTURE IN WEST AND EAST.

In Europe, at the present day, architecture is practised in a manner so anomalous and abnormal that. few if any have hitherto been able to shake off the influence of a talse system, and to see that the art of ornamental building can be based on principles of common sense, and when so practised the result not only is, but must be, satisfactory. Those who have an opportunity of seeing what perfect buildings the ignorant, uneducated entives of In dia are now producing will easily understand how success may be achieved; while those who observe what failures the best educated and most talented architects in Eurspe are constantly perpetrating may, by a study of Indian models, easily see why this must inevitably be the result. It is only in India that the two systems can now be seen pract ticed side by side-the educated and intellectual Europe aiways failing, because his principles are wrong; the feeble and uneducated native as invariably succeeding, because his principles are right. The Indian builders think only of what they are doing, and how they can best produce the effect they desire. In the European system it is considered more essential that a building, especially in its details, should be a correct copy of something else, that is good in itself or appropriate to its purpose: hence the difference in the result. In one other respects India affords a singularly favourable field to the student of architecture. In no other country of the same extent are there so many distinct nationali. its old feelings, and impressing an adades feelings and indeed an indeed the interest in the second of the second

ties, each retaining its old faith and quently no country where the outlines of ethnology as applied to art can be so easily perceived, or their application to the elucidation of the various problems so preeminently important: The mode in which the art has been practiced in Europe for the last three centuries has been'confusing.
