### THE POSSIBLE PRESIDENT.

If, by any chance, the votes for Prusi dent should not be all counted before the fourth of March, what then? Possibly the present House of Representatives may assume to declare there has been no choice by the electors: and may thereupon proceed to choose a President as provided in the constitution. Possibly, but not probably. Or the present President of the Senate may be pushed up to assume the right to count the votes, and declare a choice. But this is not probable. What then? The term of the present House will have expired. And the Constitution declares that "if the House of Representatives shall not choose a President whenever the right of choice shall devolve upnext following, then the Vice-President shall act as President," &c. This evidentconfines all action in the matter, so far as any House of Representatives is concerned, to the present House. If they do nothing before the fourth of March, the matter will be in the bands of the Senate. 
