

Club Life in London

\$1. Wines and cigars are always much cheaper than they areat hotels or other places of public resort. The number of clubs now in existence in London is astonishing. I can reckon up nearly fifty which are known, by name at least, to me, and there are probably many others which have been set up during the last year or two of which I have never heard. The fact is, that to "star" club" is now becoming a common speculation. A builder joins with two or three others in the scheme, the house is very speedi ly ran up, the upholsterer sends in the furniture "on tick," a few ad vertisements for members appear in the newspapers, and the club is launched. But in many cases it is wrecked before getting fairly out of sight of land. The entrance fee is purposely placed at a low figure, so is to attract that large number of young men who are auxious to join club, and who find the doors of the older institutions closed to them -clerks in the city, lawyers' assist ants, "sucking barriststs" and al the rest of them. They must have a elub, or think they must, and they can not afford to pay £31.10 entrance fee which is about the average sum required by the well, es. tablished clubs. And even if they could, the chances of their getting

elected are very poor. At the Athe næum, for instance, it is a common saying it a member wants his son to be a member of the club be must put his name on the candidates' list as soon as he is born. I know of a case myself in which a man entered the name of his son who is now on! ose name was entered in 1868, and who went the other day to the secretary to inquire when he was likely to come up for ballot. "Why, bless my soul, sir," said the Secretary, "you are far too young to have any chance yet." name can not come up for at least seven or eight years; so make your mind easy. At the Garrick about two years will suffice to bring a candidate's name up, and then mos likely the applicant will be black balled; for the election is decided by a committee, and the club is pretty much in the hands of a few men. who desire to keep it as much as possible to themselves, and who hate to see a new face about the building. 
