Poorness of Our Meat and Vegetable Markets.

The complaint has been universal in San Antonio the past winter that our meat and vegetable markets had sadly degenerated.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

A petition was received from the citizens of the 4th ward asking the erection of a bridge over Alamo ditch on the road leading to the new iron bridge.

A number of land owners petitioned for the opening of a street near the head of the river. Referred to the Public Improvement Committee.

Mr. F. Kaitzer, who intends building an addition to his present store, on the east side, requested the Council to instruct the City Engineer to indicate lines.

W. J. Ennis, who has been building a black chain attached to two posts on the north side of Main Plaza some months ago, said chain being so low that all pedestrians were subject to being tripped by it.

Two parties petitioned for permission to erect gas posts, free to the city on the three plazas. The petitioners to construct bill boards for advertising purposes around them.

F. G. Seltzer asked the city to repair a bridge that had fallen in on his property on the Alamo ditch, and to remove the loose dirt thrown from the ditch and encrusted his property.

Mrs. Nat Lewis asked that lot 18, given by her husband and Judge Paschal in 1858 to the city for a public park or square, be fenced in, the conditions upon which it was donated including this requirement.

The Finance committee reported various accounts correct, and recommended their payment.

Marshall Dobbin represented a need of pistols for the police, and suggested an appropriation to purchase a supply.

Assistant Marshal Perez requested payment of a small balance due as pound expenses. Recommended to be paid.

Alderman Ferguson, Chairman of the Finance Committee, presented an elaborate report upon the bids of the Hays, Frye, and Evans, for the city printing for the present fiscal year.

An appropriation was levied for the fencing of San Pedro Park, the grounds west of the Park, but belonging to it, to be enclosed.

YESTERDAY'S COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS.

A Session of Importance—Much Interesting Business Transacted.

The Council then took the following action upon the report of the committee on Petitions and Ordinances to whom had been referred the petition of business men asking the refunding of illegal license taxes paid by them since the adoption of the new State constitution.

Resolved, That the City Collector be instructed to draw up an exhibit, showing who of the tax payers have paid license tax for one or several quarters of the last fiscal year after the time, and that in conformity with the ordinance; that the amount so paid be credited on the respective tax rolls as an offset of taxes now and hereafter becoming due.

The Mayor announced that he had disposed of the land recently acquired by the city from the State for the completion of a fourth class irrigating ditch, securing for said land \$900.

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The Public Improvement Committee submitted the following regarding the improvement of San Pedro Park:

The Public Improvement Committee respectfully represents that the San Pedro Park invites the favorable consideration of Your Honorable Body, in view to a proper preservation thereof.

All the ground belonging to the park has not been fenced in, especially on the west side of the park.
