LYNCH LAW IN GEORGIA.

The Lynching of the Colored Murder er, Wells.

A Revolting Scene of Brutality.

Some days ago the Express, in its telegraphic columns, gave a brief account f the murder of a pedler named O'Brien, and of the lynching of the murderer Wells. A special to the New York Her-ald, dated at Atlanta, March 23, gives the particulars of the affair as follows:

A few days since Augusta newspapers contained an advertisement for information concerning Mr. O'Brien, a popular and well known pedler, of that city, who had been missing for several days. On Monday a negro, named Wells, was detected trying to dispose of certain articles that O'Brien was known to have had in his pack when he left Augusta for his last tour. He was arrested, and, after ahrewd evasions, was driven to the confession that he had killed O'Brien and robbed him. He then took his captors to an unfrequented part of the woods, where they found O'Brien's body carefully hidden away. The skull was terribly crushed with an axe, and it was apparent that he had died without a struggle. Wells stated that he met O'Brien in the woods and assaulted him with the axe, killing him at the first blow. The excitement that followed the news of the murder was so intense that the authorities of Wayne county proposed to carry the prisoner to Augusta fearing an outbreak in the city, and declaring that he would prevent lynching if he had, to call out the military, instructed the City Attorney to notify the Waynesboro officials that the prisoner to Augusta. He was lodged in the Waynesboro Jall.


