Kansas Grasshopper Law. Text describing the legislative act regarding grasshoppers.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas. Section 1. That the township trustees of the different townships and the mayors of cities which are not included in any township of any county within this State are hereby authorized and it is made their duty when so requested in writing by fifteen of the legal voters of the township or city, to issue orders to the road overseers of the different road districts within their respective townships or cities, to warn all able bodied males between the ages of twelve and fifty years within their respective districts for the purpose of destroying locusts or migratory insects.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of road overseers immediately after receiving said orders to proceed at once to warn out all persons liable under section one of this act, giving notice of the time and place of meeting, and the tools to be used, and the kind of work expected to be performed, and all work shall be done and performed under the direction of the road overseer.

Section 3. Any person over eighteen years of age warned out as provided in this act may pay the road overseer the sum of one dollar per day for the time so warned out, and in case any person shall fail to perform labor under this act or paying the sum of one dollar when so warned out, shall be adjudged of a misdemeanor and on conviction shall be fined the sum of three dollars for each day so failing or refusing, and the money so collected shall be expended by the road overseer in the destruction of grasshoppers in their respective districts.

Section 4. For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this act the road overseer is authorized to enter the premises of any person lying within the township where such order of the township trustee is in force, with a sufficient number of hands and teams to perform such labor as he may deem necessary for the public good.

Section 5. It shall be the duty of the secretary of the State board of agriculture immediately after the passage of this act, to compile in circular form all information relating to the manner and means heretofore used for the exterminating of grasshoppers, and send at least ten copies of the same to each township trustee in the State.

The Emperor William as a Lover. A youth of Prussia, Prince William of Prussia, entered France with the allied invaders of 1815. More than half a century passed, and when in 1870 the Prussian guards rode into Dizier, Angeline Barner, a stout matron now, received their officers into her house and showed them the precious souvenir still glittering where the Prince's diamond had scratched it. The story was too good to keep, and it traveled from lip to lip till it reached the royal headquarters at Versailles. William went straight to the house and presented himself before his old sweetheart. "Angeline!" he exclaimed, "who could have dreamed you would kiss and tell!" The matron, in confusion, began to excuse herself, and the gallant old King caught up her hand and exclaimed, "who could have dreamed you would kiss and tell!"

Some sad scenes attend the death of a Congress. Several men of distinction were the other day, one who had had an honorable though uneventful and unimportant career. The Way to Make Philadelphia Butter. The following is the method employed in making the celebrated Philadelphia butter. The milk is skimmed after standing twenty-four hours and the cream is put into deep vessels having a capacity of about twelve gallons. It is kept at a temperature of fifty-eight or fifty-nine degrees, until it requires a slightly acid taste, when it goes to the churn. The churn is a barrel revolving on a journal in each end, and driven by horse power. The churning occupies an hour; and after that the buttermilk is drawn off. This is repeated until the water as it is drawn is nearly free from milkiness. The butter is worked with butter-walkers, a stamped cloth mean while being pressed upon it to absorb the moisture and free it of buttermilk. The cloth is frequently dipped in cold water and dried during the process of "wiping the butter." It is next salted at the rate of an ounce of salt to 3 pounds of butter, thoroughly and evenly incorporated by means of the butter-walker. It is then removed to a table, where it is weighed out and put into pound prints. After this it goes into large tin trays and is set in the water to harden, remaining until next morning, when it is wrapped in damp cloths and placed upon shelves one above the other, in the tin-lined cedar tubs, with ice in the compartments at the ends, and then goes immediately to market. Matting is drawn over the tub, and it is surrounded again by oilcloth, so as to keep out the hot air and dust, and the butter arrives in prime condition, commanding the highest price.
