The within article from the Castroville Era gives an account of the shooting of a lad named Jim Quigley. His friends in San Antonio will be glad to hear that he was no horse thief, and had no connection whatever with the band spoken of. He shot Mr. Jesse Campbell a few weeks ago, and his real crime consists in his being drunk at the time of the shooting. Under the circumstances, Mr. Campbell's family do not blame him, and have brought him to the American House in Castroville for medical assistance, and Mr. Campbell's brothers are carefully and kindly nursing the notorious Jim Quigley, as he is called in the Era. Mr. Campbell was shot by Quigley in the thigh, and had a slight flesh wound, from which he is nearly well. He returned home some time since. Quigley's shoulder is broken, having something like ten bullets in it. He is an orphan bey, dependent on his arms for support. If he recovers from the wound he must be a cripple, and in a measure, helpless for life. People zealous to arrest criminals should be careful that they arrest the proper parties, and especially careful whom they shoot.

Twenty Thousand Dollars in Gold Found in a Cave in Hampton County

Charleston, April 16.—The News and Courier has trustworthy information that the Rev. W. H. Soott, the colored preactor reported to the New England Methodist Conference on Friday as having been murdered, is alive and well, and performing his pastoral duties without mclestation, in Marlborough county, in this State [From the Morristown (Tenn.) Gazette.]
There is a very strange story, yet nevertheless a true one, to be given you for your readers. In the early history of East Tennessee, about 1794, as near as can be determined, three men by the name of Patterson, all brothers, visited the New Market Valley, with the intention of buying the rich and extensive lands near what is known as Panther Springs. They brought with them a large amount of money, supposed to be from \$20,000 to \$50,000, in Mexican coin. While looking over the lands they were murdered and their money and other articles of value taken from their persons by a hunter, and their bones burnt in a Deadwood City, April 16 .- Crazy Horse's Fail deceived them by representing that only the arms captured from Caster-would be taken from them. 


