Terrific Storm at Galves ton.

Galveston, April 24.—A very severe gale, accompanied by rain and hait, visited this coast at 9.45 this morning. It lasted only ten or fifteen minutes, but during that time the wind blew at the rate of 63 miles per heur. Considerable damage was done to buildings in the city, and the shipping in the barbor. The following are among the losses: G. H. & H. R. freight shed, 300 leet long was blown down, and part of the round bouse demolished. Eleven freight cars were destroyed. Parts of the walls of the Gulf City press, Bayers press and shippors press were torn down.

Turnley's warehouse, Taylor's warehouse, Sorley's block, Nicholl's block, Rasenberg's block, Moody & Jemison's block and Fox's building were partially unroofed. Residences in various parts of the city were demolished.
