Brains to Treat the Hands. (From the Frontiersman.)

One manner of thus giving vitality to the too dead-and-alive pursuit of farming is, a State Bureau to gather data to order the distributor rare and desirable seeds...

We do not purpose now entering into details of a plan for a State Experimental Farm, which should be in the mode of all farms. It is enough to say here that it should do not only the working for itself, but the thinking for those not having time; capacity or means; it should not only plan, but execute; and be able to say, periodically, directly to each earnest laborer, 'what did I commit to the warm bosom of earth, and what returns and what the result is here.'

Application of Manure.

A correspondent of the American Cultivator says that if he were asked to name some valuable mode of applying farm-yard manure which had not been received with general favor, he should at once instance that of manuring in the hill or drill. In his experiments he has invariably found that for mere purpose of withholding long-continued dry weather, these plants whose roots have immediate access to organic manures will be much better enabled to absorb the necessary supplies of moisture than those of vegetable in an unmanured soil.
