In all well regulated and well governed cities—cities that pay any attention at all to the system of drainage—the curb and gutters are the first things made, and always at the expense of the city, while the cost of making the balance of the street is charged to the property npou both sides, according to the amount of front on said street, or, in other words, (and more in practice) the city pays one-third of the expense. Now, the tax upon this one-third of the amount thus expended is what I call a legitimate tax, and should be borne by all. But "Citizen No. 2" says, those poor men—of whom I spoke—would not be able "to meet this audden demand," and would be obliged to "sell out" to their "rich neighbor." Let us see, in the first place (should we ever be fortunate enough to get under such a charter, for I have no reference, understand me, to the one under which we live at present) a street is not made except upon petition signed by two thirds of cept upon potition signed by two thirds of all the property owners on both sides; and secondly, the prata assessment is not collected at once, but divided by the num-


