A Good Deal of Cry, not Much Wool. A General Movement of the Russian Army Commenced.

A Roumanian General's Experience in Giving a False Alarm

The Gossip at the National Capital. Interest from Here and

London, May 16.—The recoption of the Grand Duke Nicholas at Bucharest was cold, not a single cheer being given.

The Russian war vessel escaped from Schastopol and reached Batoum Sunday night. When seven miles from shore she sent four boats with torpedoes to attack the Turkish frigate in the Roadstead but all were driven off. Two reached the port, and the fate of the others is unknown. The steamer disappeared. The Russians attach importance to the escaped steamer as showing the inefficiency of the Sebastopol blockade. The Turks have dispatched 16,900 men from the garrison at Widin to the Broudukscha in all haste. Roumanna officially reports 400 wounded in Kalafat during the bombardment.

The Roumanian party which demands active co-operation with Russia, is held in check by foreign influence which favors temporizing the policy. The Servian volunteers are constantly passing the frontier to join the Bosman insurgents. The circassians, who have risen in trans-Circassian Russia, have destroyed all the telegraph lines. A defeat of the Russians near Batoum with four thousand killed is generally believed. The impression appears general at Widin that no quarter is allowed Roumanians who cross the Danube.

Lordon, May 16.—A great movement has commenced among the Russian troops on the opposite bank at Giurgevo. Eight battalions of Russian infantry, several batteries of artillery and a squadron of cavalry passed through Giurgevo, following the road to Simintf. They have considerable force at Kanona, and desultory firing is going on. The Turkish troops are entrenched, and the Russians are apparently attempting to force the Danube, or by a maneuvre draw away the Turks from other points. Up to a late hour last night they were not succeessful.

London, May 16.—The Pall Mall Gazette's Paris dispatch says Minister Simon resigned because of the continued hostility monifested by the Chamber of Deputies. Efforts are making to induce him to reconsider his action.


