Rye and barley were cultivated this season upon a larger scale than in the past, bringing the undoubtable conclusion that this is a great rye and barley country.

Irisl. potatoes can be produced in Western Texas sufficient in quantity to supply half the American nation. When the seasons are unfavorable, from 125 to 175 bushels to the acre, about a half crop, are raised, but this being a good season, upwards of 300 bushels are generally counted upon.

It is sufficient to say that our general crop prospect is very good, and farmers are at present over-joyed at the results of their labers. Should the war in Europe continue, wheat will command a high price, will be drawn from local to foreign markets, and corn will be in more active demand. Should our government, in detense of her honor and the rights of her citizens, venture an invasion and chastisement of Mexico, her troops would find active service in that section of our sister Republic immediately approximate to our State. The presence of these troops would create a demand for our potatoes, corn, oats, etc., and the heavy harvest of these products would redound not only to the benefit of our agriculturalists, but to the convenience and comfort of the army.

Mexico certainly should meet a condign and for her disrespect and contempt of American citizenship upon her own soil. It is hoped for the interest of our long suffering frontier that this punishment will be speedily brought. In the event that it does come, Western Texas will reap the double benefit of future security from Mexican bratality, and a better price for her farm products.


