Sterling Boys Capture San Angelo Fat Stock Show

Sterling 4-H and F. F. A. Clubs Win 10 Out 15 First Places in Singles; First in Carlot, and Grand Champion For Sheep

Sterling Breeders In The Money

Bade Brothers Exhibit A Grand Champion For The Fifth Consecutive Year

Sterling boys captured the Fat Stock Show at San Angelo which ended last Monday by taking 10 of the 15 first places for single exhibits in fat lambs; won grand champion and reserve champion of the show; 1st and 2nd places for the best 3 lambs fed by one boy, and 1st place for the carlot of fat lambs, thus establishing the greatest winning for one county in the history of the San Angelo Fat Stock Show.

Here is how the boys stood: Singles: R. D. Garrett, first; Sam Augustine, second; Winston Churchill fifth; C. J. Copeland, sixth; Louis Blane, ninth; Benney Green, tenth; Neal J. Reed, eleventh; Jack Durham, thirteenth; Jimmy Mack Mathis, fourteenth; Neal J. Reed 15th; Tommy Augustine, 21st; Charles Churchill, 24th. The prizes in this event were from \$15 for 1st to \$1.25 for the 24th. R. D. Garrett received \$6.25 additional for exhibiting the grand champion lamb.

Best 3 lambs fed by one boy: R. D. Garrett, 1st; Neil J. Reed, 5th; Jimmie Mack Mathis, 7th; Tommy Augustine, 9th. Prizes in this event ranged from \$12.50 to \$2.50. 30 lambs were shown.

Best carlot of lambs: Sterling County 4 H, 1st; Sterling County F. F. A. 2nd. Prizes received by these clubs were \$50 and \$40. 10 counties competed.

Rambouillet ram lambs: Neil J. Reed, 3rd; Ira Langford 7th, and 20; Claude Broome, 18th. Prizes in this

event were \$5 and \$2 for 3rd and 7th places. Lambs shown in this event was 72.

Rambouillet ewe lambs: Claude Broome, 1st and 3rd; Ross Foster, 4th. Prizes received were \$9, \$5 and \$4. 56 lambs were shown.

Delaine ram lambs: George Mills, 2nd and 6th, with prizes of \$7 and \$2.50. 21 sheep were shown.

Delaine ewe lambs: Woodrow Mills, 6th, awarded \$2.50. 21 sheep were exhibited.

In the men's breeding class of sheep Bade Bros. exhibited the grand champion Delaine ewe. This is the 5th consecutive year that Bade Bros. have exhibited the grand champion in the Delaine breeding class. They also took 2nd and 3rd places for ram lambs; 1st and 4th for ewe lambs; 1st and 5th for Rambouillet ram lambs; 2nd for Rambouillet ewe lambs; 1st for breeders lamb flock; fourth for get of sire, and 1st for pen of 3 lambs.

Fred Hodges, breeder of registered Rambouillets exclusively, was also in the money. His placings were as follows: Aged ram, 3rd; ram lamb, 4; aged ewe, 5th; yearling ewe, 2nd; ewe lamb, 6th; exhibitor's flock, 4th and lamb flock 4th.

Jim Bob Clark placed 4th with his two-tooth yearling Delaine ram.

At the auction sale last Monday, Garrett's 125-lb. grand champion lamb brought \$125; Sam Augustine's reserve champion lamb sold at 50c per pound, while the 4 H Club's 25 lambs brought 12c per lb. and the F. F. A. Club's went at 8 1/4c per lb. The sale of R. D. Garrett's lamb and his winnings in prizes totaled \$198.75.

In the auction sale of fat calves fed by Sterling boys, the following were the results: Ross Foster, 12 1/2c; Jack Mitchell, 11 1/4c; Fred Currie, 13c; Earl Smith, 11c; Bubba Foster, 11 3/4c; Loyd Sharp, 10 3/4c; Fred Mitchell, 12 1/2c.

This was the greatest stock show San Angelo has ever held. It is estimated that more than 1800 head of livestock were on exhibit, and among these were to be found some of the world's best cattle and

sheep.

The Sterling County 4 H Club was coached by H. P. Malloy, County Agent, while the F. F. A. Club was coached by H. M. Carter, vocational agriculture instructor in Sterling high school. These two men know their jobs, as has been fully demonstrated, and Sterling congratulates herself upon having such instructors, and is grateful for their energetic, patient and efficient work.

LEGISLATIVE ACTIVITIES

By Senator Penrose B. Metcalfe

Our Constitutional Amendments Committee referred all three joint resolutions proposing to amend the constitution to submit a sales tax, a transaction tax and a modified transaction tax, to a sub-committee composed of Senators Clint Small, A. M. Aikin, Jr., and Olan R. Van Zandt, and instructed the sub-committee to back march 13. They will study the tax plans and will recommend a consolidated plan to the Constitutional Amendment Committee.

The Governor sent up a message asking immediate legislative attention to promoting the Big Bend Park in West Texas. He did not recommend any specific appropriation, but said the Park would yield the State a very high return on the money it would be necessary for the State to invest. The bill, introduced in the Senate by H. L. Winfield of Ft. Stockton and in the House by A. R. Cauthorn of Del Rio, is to set up an organization for acquisition of the necessary land.

The committee on Commerce and Manufacturing reported favorably the Fair Trade Act bill by Senator J. Franklin Spears of San Antonio, the bill in which the independent merchants are so vitally interested.

Booker T. Washington

Booker T. Washington was born the child of a slave, but he later achieved heights that are rare to both the white man and the Negro. I admired Washington for his courage and his never ending attempts to help his race. Even though he had been a slave, he held no malice toward those who had held him in thrall. The autobiography of Booker T. Washington shows what can be done when one puts forth effort. The most impressive thing in his life story, to me, was the occasion of his speech at Atlanta, Georgia, on behalf of the condition of the Negroes. So clearly did he speak, so fervent was his zeal that many of Atlanta's prominent white citizens went to him later and told him they sympathized with his mission to lift his race. Many Southerners told him that he was the first Negro they had ever called "Mr."

Besides being the outstanding leader of his race he ranks as one of the greatest orators of his time. —Sammie Lee Cunniff

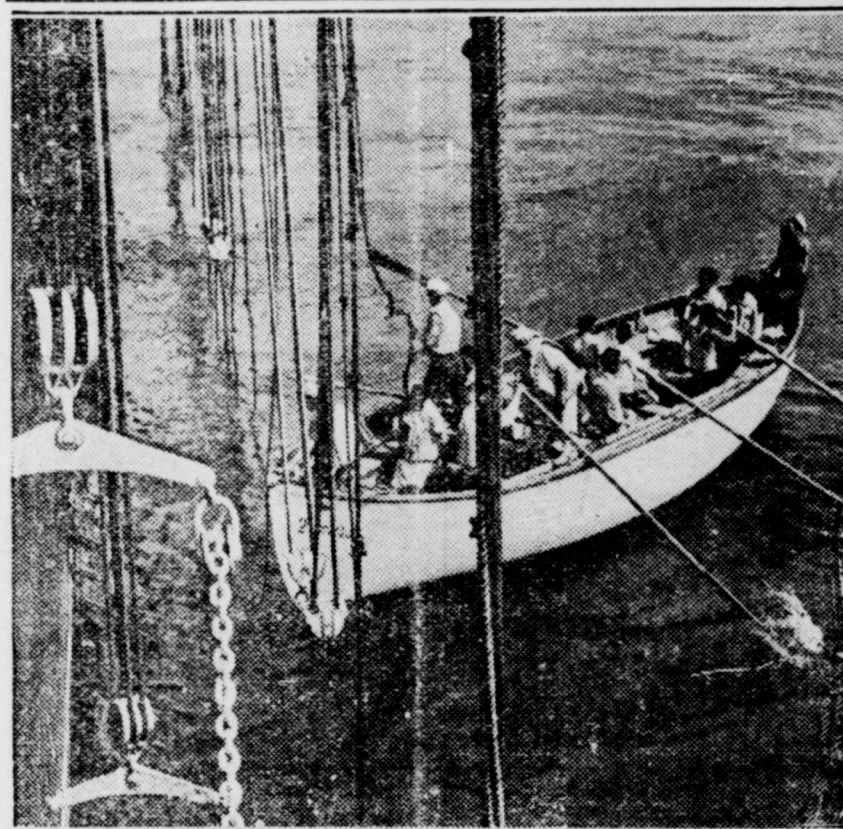

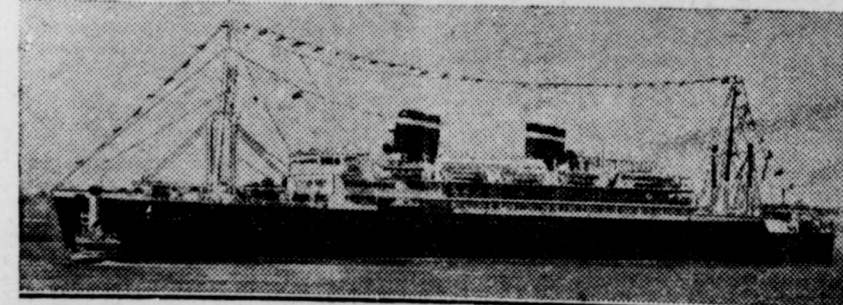
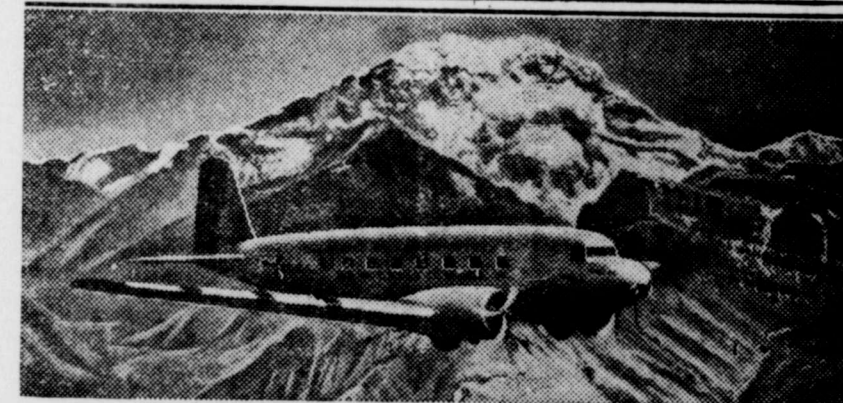

Transportation facilities to South America have gone a long way since the turn of the century. Then the quickest route to South America was by way of Europe. Today such giant airliners, as this Pan American-Grace Douglas DC-2, a fourteen passenger plane cruising at 170 miles per hour, bring New York within four and one-half days of Buenos Aires. While by sea, the Grace Line "Santa Lucia" has reduced the one-way sea trip from 62 days under sail to 19 days by steam.
