Charles Spurgeon, a prominent Baptist preacher, had the Communion every Sunday (1 Cor. 11:20) and (1 Cor. 16:1-2) shows that it was the custom to assemble every Lord's Day. (Heb. 10:25) teaches not to forsake it. Christ was loyal to the requirements of the Old Law, and condemned all evasions of its ordinances while it was in force, and one jot or tittle could not pass till fulfilled. Is it possible one should be indifferent to this appointment of the New Testament?

Take It Easy!

YOU don't have to rush around madly, nor does everything have to come to a full stop for your family to have wholesome and satisfying meals during the pre-holiday season. Plan quick, simple, one-dish main courses and let the dessert give the touch of glamour every meal should have. Serve family favorites; and now and then surprise them with something new—like these Coconut Cupcakes. The happy "surprise" comes when they bite into them and find that the coconut has been baked right in the batter, giving these little cakes a delicate, different flavor.

Coconut Cupcakes

1½ cups sifted cake flour; 1½ teaspoons double-acting baking powder; ½ teaspoon salt; ½ cup butter or other shortening; 1 cup sugar; 2 eggs, well beaten; ½ cup milk; ½ teaspoon vanilla; 1½ cups shredded coconut.

Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt, and sift together three times. Cream butter, add sugar gradually, and cream together until light and fluffy. Add eggs and beat well. Add flour, alternately with milk, a small amount at a time, beating after each addition until smooth. Add vanilla and coconut and blend. Turn into greased muffin pans, filling each ½ full. Bake in moderate oven (375° F.) 15 minutes, or until done. Makes 16 cupcakes.

How Church Chimes Rang For the Benefit of Brooklyn

This week I'd like to spin a little story — a very, very little story. It's of no great importance, and I won't get mad if the editor decides to file it in the wastebasket, and in its place print some big story about Marshal Tito or Rita Hayworth's baby.

To begin with, this story concerns itself with a church, and a lot of bright people will tell you a church is no longer of any importance in this test-tube and Eunsen-burner age. To make matters worse, the church is in Brooklyn, and — well, I guess you've heard plenty of jokes about how unimportant Brooklyn is. . . .

One day last summer while driving past a church on St. Felix street in Brooklyn, I heard a set of chimes that did nice things to my ears. They were unusually good chimes, and figured to have cost a lot of money. Naturally, I wondered how they happened to be in the belfry of a modest church in a modest neighborhood.

"What's the church with the chimes?" I asked a newsstand proprietor.

"Hanson Place Central Church," he said. "It's Methodist."

"No," said the newsie. "I think they put them in about a year ago."

The next day I did some telephoning, and I liked what I found out.

WHEN REV. Next day a member of his parish phoned. "I've been discussing the bells with my business partner," said the parishioner, "and we'd each like to donate a third of the cost. But there's a hitch."

"What is it?" asked the Reverend.

Reverend Zeiter said he didn't think it would make any difference at all.

"We think," continued the businessman, "that it would be a good idea to find a Catholic to put up the other third. After all, people of all faiths are going to enjoy these bells."

THE NEXT DAY a Catholic in the neighborhood offered to put up the remaining third, and the Carillon bells were ordered. At the dedication ceremony a couple of months later, a plaque was put up on the wall of this Methodist church, and inscribed on it were the names of the Catholic, the Protestant and the Jew. . . .

And that's all there is to this story—this very, very little story. Do I think this one set of electrically-controlled bells is going to eliminate religious bigotry in Brooklyn? Of course not. Do I think the people in Flatbush who hear the chimes are going to be kinder and more tolerant? Again, of course not.

Why, then, am I writing this piece? Well, I guess it's because I'm fool enough to think that even one drop of clean water falling on a dusty street is important. Who knows? It may clean up an inch of ground and give somebody else an idea.

One of these days—and I don't expect to be around to see it—a lot of drops of clean water may fall and a lot of dust may be washed away.

This is a separate, distinct and specific license. A Sanitary Plumber's License, or a Master Plumber's License does NOT permit the holder to install butane or propane equipment. The fact that a store SELLS butane and propane appliances DOES NOT permit the storekeeper to INSTALL such equipment.

Some plumbers, and some merchants and their employes have taken the Gas Utilities Division examinations and have qualified and ARE LICENSED by the Gas Utilities Division to make such installations. BUT ALL HAVE NOT.

When any person, lacking this specific and distinct license, installs butane or propane equipment or piping THAT PERSON IS VIOLATING THE LAW OF TEXAS. This law was made for YOUR protection. Please DO NOT be a party to its violation.

For Your Information

Be SURE that ANY person working on your butane or propane equipment, or making installations of piping or connections of such equipment, is LEGALLY AND PROPERLY LICENSED to DO THIS WORK — licensed by the Gas Utilities Division of the Texas Railroad Commission.

If you are not POSITIVELY CERTAIN that an installer is so licensed DON'T TAKE A CHANCE — FIND OUT! You are invited to ASK the undersigned Association (the statewide organization of LICENSED and QUALIFIED BUTANE AND PROPANE DEALERS). A post card will bring you the answer to your question and the name of a PROPERLY LICENSED MAN near you — a man trained, qualified and LICENSED for YOUR protection.

Don't be a party to the violation of this Law that was passed for YOUR protection.
