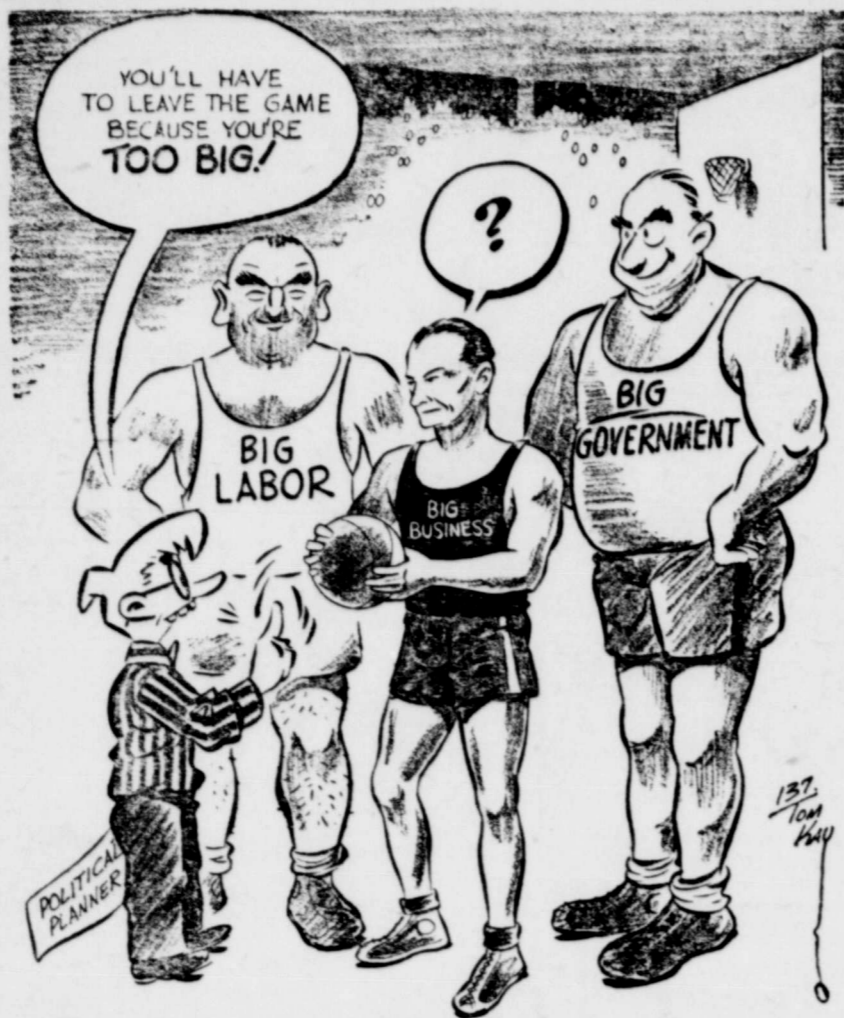


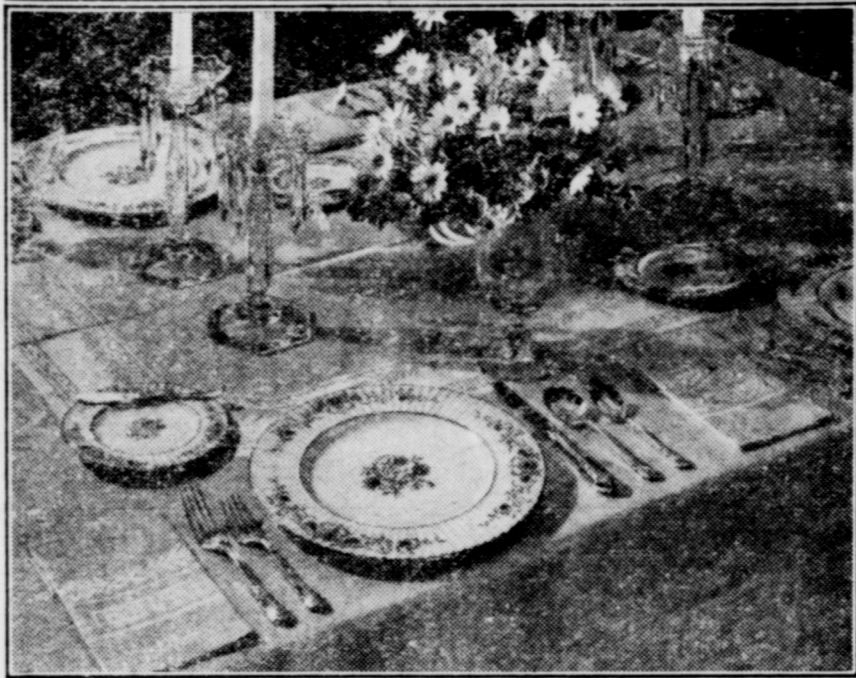

**Cinderella Goes to a Party**

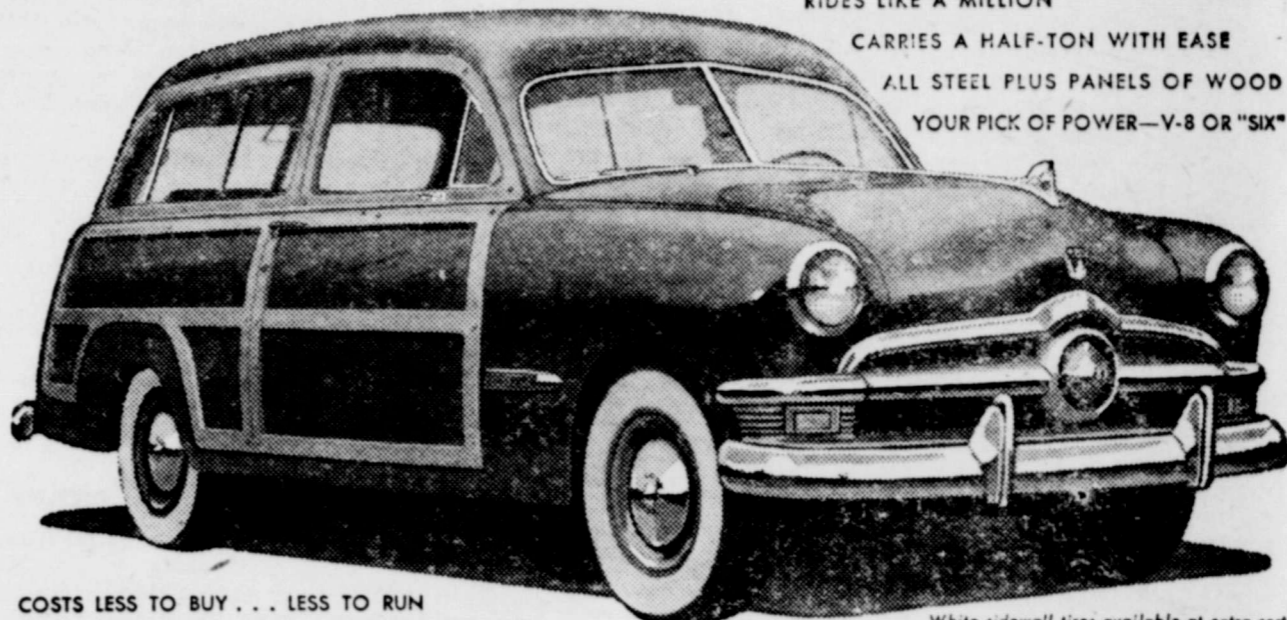

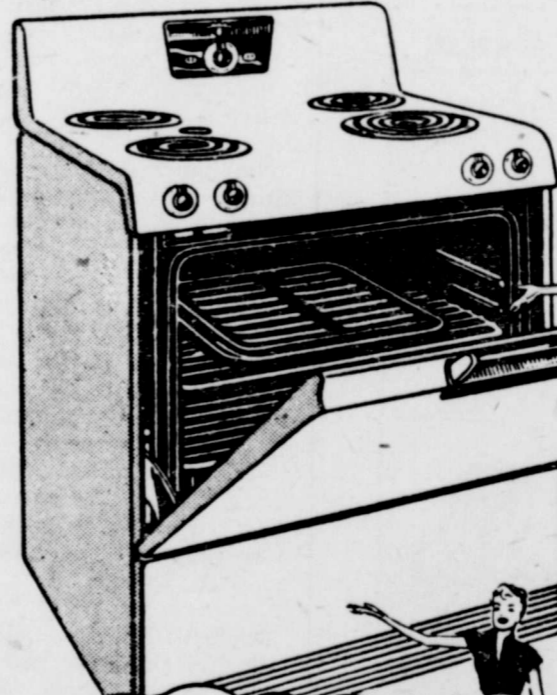

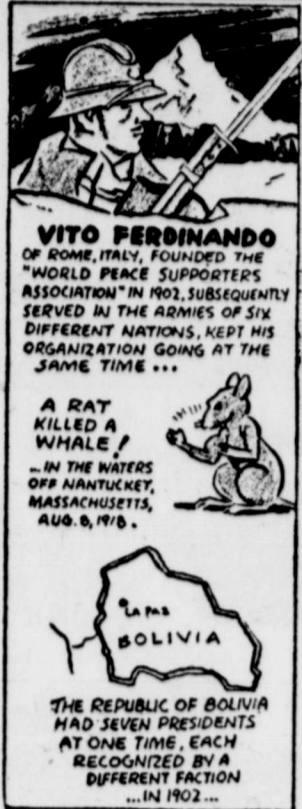

Perk up winter-weary appetites with this easy-to-prepare recipe! The whole family loves tasty golden brown fried chicken served with smooth cream gravy. Frying with salad oil is economical and such a joy to use.

**Home-Style Fried Chicken**  
1 frying chicken (2 1/4 to 3 pounds)  
1 cup flour  
1 teaspoon salt  
1/4 teaspoon pepper  
1 cup Mazola Salad Oil (for frying)

Have butcher cut frying chicken into serving pieces. Wash; drain. Put flour, salt and pepper in paper bag. Place chicken in bag and shake well to coat each piece of chicken with seasoned flour. Heat 1 cup salad oil in heavy skillet, over medium heat for about 3 minutes (oil should be 1/4 inch deep in pan). With fork, carefully place chicken into hot salad oil. (The use of two pans will greatly simplify the cooking.) Fry, turning frequently, until tender and well browned, 15 to 30 minutes. Remove chicken; drain on absorbent paper. If chicken is larger—cover after browning and allow to cook slowly until tender. Delicious served plain or with hot Cream Gravy. Makes 4 servings.

**Cream Gravy:** Pour off all but 1/2 cup salad oil used for frying. Add 1/4 cup of the seasoned flour left from coating chicken. Blend well. Gradually add 3 cups milk, stirring constantly with wooden spoon. Bring to a boil and boil 2 minutes. Add additional salt and pepper to taste. Makes 4 to 5 servings.

Our WASHINGTON Letter

Thousands of visitors thronged the streets of Washington last week during the annual Cherry Blossom Festival which coincided with Easter this year. The corridors of the capitol were crowded with parties of school children and other sight-seers from nearby states who took advantage of the holiday to visit Washington. It is too bad that Texas is so far away that our school children cannot readily visit their nation's capitol to view the many historic sights that should be a part of every youngster's education.

The House is in the midst of its annual ten-day Easter recess which enables members to visit constituents at home or catch up on back work. The Senate is back in session after a four day lay off in an effort to catch up with the House since its rules of procedure make progress somewhat slower than in the lower chamber.

**MOHAIR**  
Last year the Department of Agriculture and the Texas Sheep and Goat Raisers Association undertook a project to promote the use of mohair. The Department furnished \$20,000 and \$10,000 was raised by contributions from members of the Association to hire a private contractor to carry out the research and service work of the project.

The contractor has conducted extensive interviews among manufacturers, wholesalers and retailers to determine the changes in style, technological processes, and alternative raw materials which has resulted in the decreased demand for mohair. Textile engineering laboratories are being employed to develop fabrics made of mohair or mohair combined with other fibers such as cotton and synthetic staples. Prospective or improved uses of mohair are being investigated for such products as knitting yarns, furniture coverings, clothing, draperies, carpets, auto seat upholstery and many others.

This project represents a splendid effort on the part of the mohair producers to develop their industry to meet the ever-changing demands of the public. A committee composed of various Agriculture Department officials supervises the project and meets every few weeks to review the progress being made by the contractor. I sit in on the meetings informally on behalf of the mohair producers. When the project is completed the committee hopes to have accumulated much valuable information that will pro-

vide many additional uses for mohair products.
