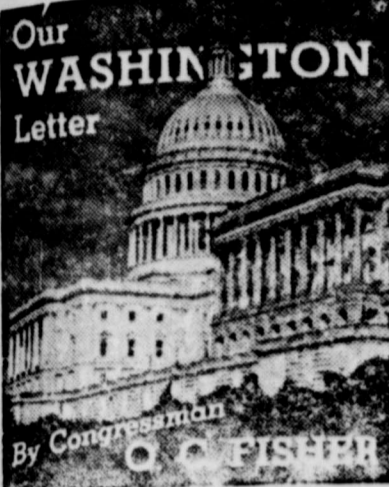

TEXAS HELD ITS OWN in 1950 as sixth in population among the States, according to official returns from the census takers over the nation. It was that way following the 1940 count. The state as a whole gained a total of 1,262,000, however. This increase may give Texas an additional congressman next year. At present we have 21.

It is interesting to note the population trends over the State. As expected, the heavy gains were in the big city and coastal industrial areas at the expense of the rural sections. Harris County jumped from 528,961 to 801,169, to become the most densely populated county in the State. Next is Dallas County which upped its count from 398,564 in 1940 to 612,318 this year. Bexar County now has 496,000—a gain of 163,000.

IN CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS, the trend varied. Six of the 21 lost population in the 10-year span, mostly in East Texas. In our Congressional district, the Census gives us a net increase of 7,719, the total now being 266,144. Nine of our 27 counties gained population, the other 18 lost.

Several people have asked me how our district will fare in the event Texas gains another representative in the Congress. That will be determined by the State legislature, whose duty it is to redistrict following the decennial census reports—where the total number of representatives is changed.

IT OFTEN HAPPENS that the State legislatures hesitate to give any one county more than one Congressman, regardless of its size when big metropolitan centers are involved. If that should be the case in Texas and if Dallas, Harris and Bexar counties are allowed only one representative each, then outside of those three, the other districts would have an average of 303,562 people.

In that event, the 21st congressional district would fall short of the average by 37,418. The most a state legislature can do is to divide the district about equal with some variations being inevitable. But if the legislature should equalize the population into districts—outside Bexar, Harris and Dallas counties—and divide the counties on that basis among the 19 congressional districts, our district if it should remain intact would be entitled to add enough counties to bring us up to the state average, which would mean the addition of enough counties to total 37,418 people.

ON THE OTHER HAND, the district to the west—the El Paso district—which includes everything from the New Mexico border to the western boundary of the 21st district, if it should be given the average would lose 50,326.

And, to the northwest, the Lubbock district which joins ours

would stand to lose a total of 54,476 in order to bring its average down to state average outside the three big counties. But the Abilene district which joins us, having lost population, would be entitled to have its population increased by 78,221 to be average population-wise.

So, unless there should be a complete reshuffling of districts over the entire State, our district instead of losing should gain perhaps two or three additional counties when the redistricting is acted upon at Austin.

"Covering the County"

If any of you are troubled with Bermuda, Johnson, and other grass, and want to kill it, use tri-chloracetate, usually called T.C.A. T.C.A. should be mixed at the rate of 2-3 to 3-4 pounds per gallon of water and spray on the foliage. One gallon will usually cover about 100 square feet, depending on the size and density of the plants.

You should be able to see a drying of the plants in about 24 hours after spraying. Most of the plants that are going to die will so within a week. Hot, dry conditions with a moderate degree of soil moisture gives best results. If T.C.A. is sprayed directly on the ground it will sterilize the ground for about 60-120 days.

T.C.A. at the present can not be bought in large quantities, but should be available soon. At the Blackland Station, sodium T.C.A. gave a 90% kill in 21 days and 100% kill in 4½ months at 4lb per hundred square foot.

Since Clinton and Henry gave the grass demonstration last week at the Lion's Club, several have asked about their grass on lawns and other places. A grass plant can be compared to the human body—that is, if it does not get enough food it will die.

The grass plant gets its food and water from the soil and sunlight. If the top is kept too closely mowed or grazed, the roots do not have a chance to grow into the ground and take up the food. When the grass is kept mowed too short it will thin out and allow weeds to come in and will probably choke the grass out.

The recommended mowing heights for Bermuda or any other lawn grass is: until June 1, ¾ to 1 inch; June 1 to August 1, 1½ to 2 inches; August 1 to October 1, 2 to 2¼ inches. After October 1 do not mow. If you can convince your wife on this you are doing fairly well.

If you intend to have a fall garden, August is the month to prepare the ground and make early plantings.

The best vegetables to start with would be the spring vegetables. Tomatoes, okra, peppers, and egg plants will produce if properly cared for. When planting seed use 20 to 25% more seed than when planting in the spring and cover the seed a little deeper. The garden will probably need some fertilizer. Four pounds of 5-10-5 for each 100 feet of row space is good. Two pounds of 16-20-0 would be plenty on 100 feet.

Sterling County High In March of Dimes

Sterling County was high in the Central Texas area in the past MOD drive. According to figures just released by the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, Inc. A. T. Bratton, who acted as drive chairman for Sterling County was informed this week that Sterling per capita's gifts was .8300 (83c) per person for the county. This compares with the Texas average of .2072, not quite 21c for the state as a whole.

Chairman Bratton received the following letter from Ralph E.

Frede, Central Texas director for the Foundation last week:

"We have just received from National headquarters a breakdown on the 1950 MOD Campaign, showing the per capita for each county. I am sure you will be pleased to know that under your direction the Sterling County per capita receipts averaged .8300, thereby exceeding the Texas per capita average of .2072. This 83c average was also the highest for any county within the Central Texas area, and makes it easily apparent that the campaign

must have been in very capable hands.

"Congratulations, and thanks again to you and the others in Sterling County whose generous donations of time and effort as well as money made possible this fine result.

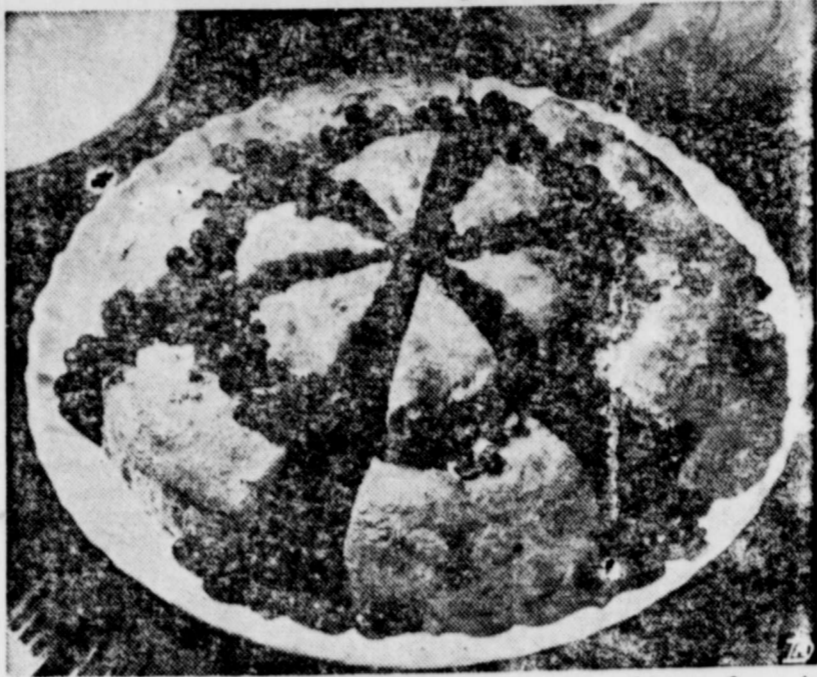

1½ cups sifted enriched flour	¼ to ½ cup milk

2 teaspoons baking powder	2 cups blueberries
½ teaspoon salt	¼ cup sugar
1 egg	Additional blueberries

Sift together flour, ½ cup sugar, baking powder and salt. Beat egg. Add milk and shortening. Stir into flour mixture, mixing until batter is smooth. Stir in 1¼ cups blueberries. Pour into greased 9-inch layer pan. Arrange remaining ¼ cup blueberries over

batter in a circle. Sprinkle ¼ cup sugar over coffee cake. Bake in moderately hot oven (400° F.) 25 minutes. When coffee cake is baked, cut in wedges, pull apart, retaining the circular shape and garnish with additional berries. Makes 1 9-inch coffee cake.

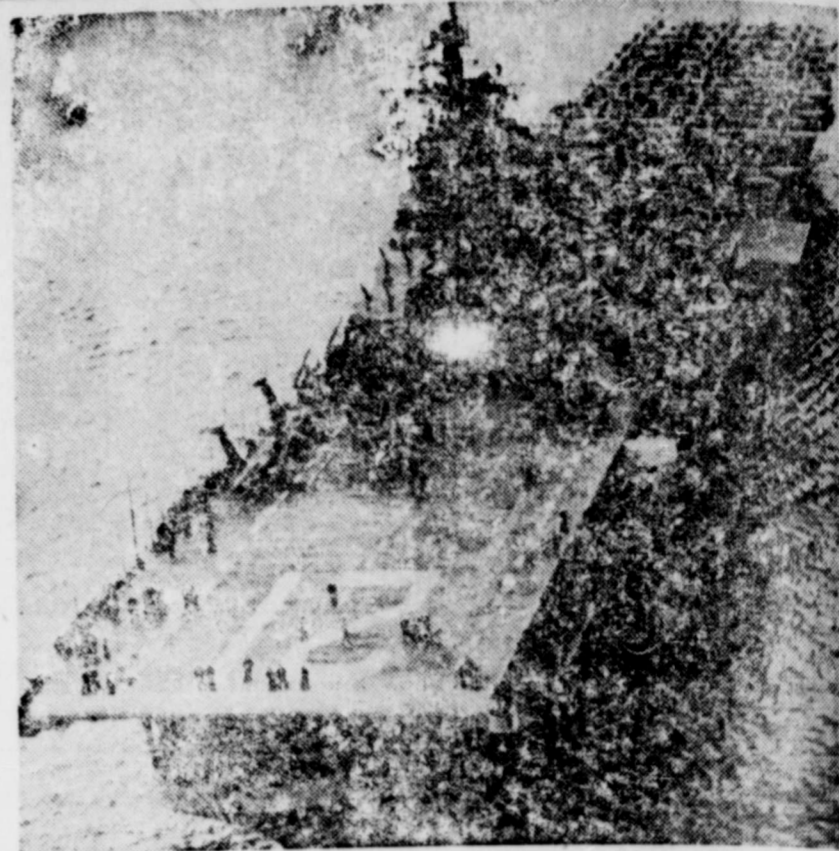

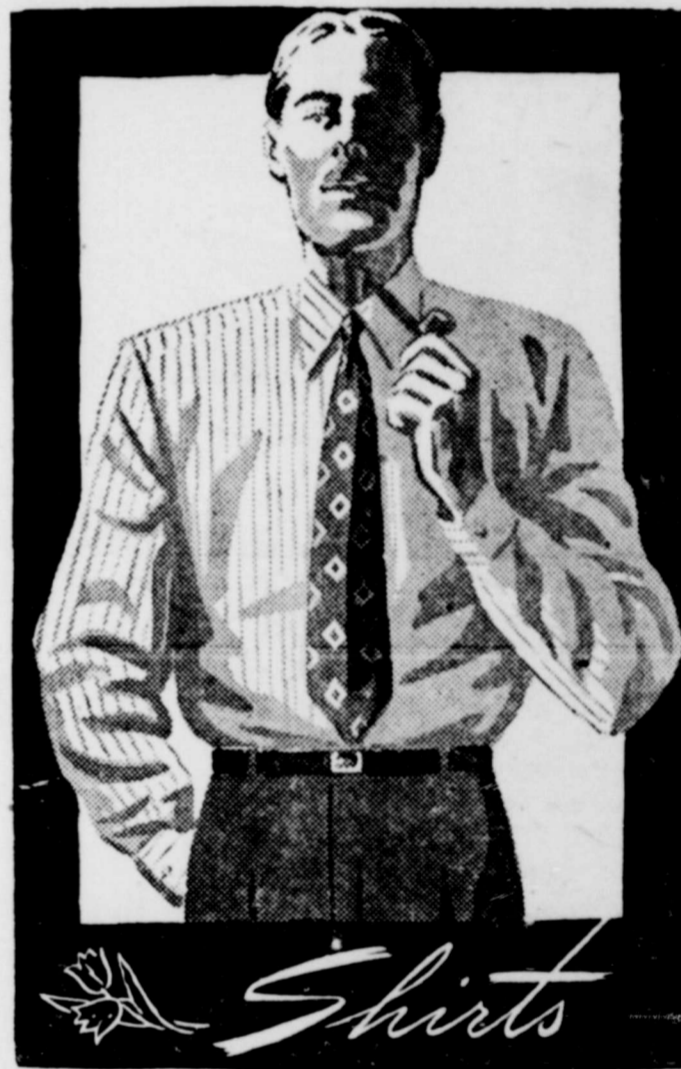

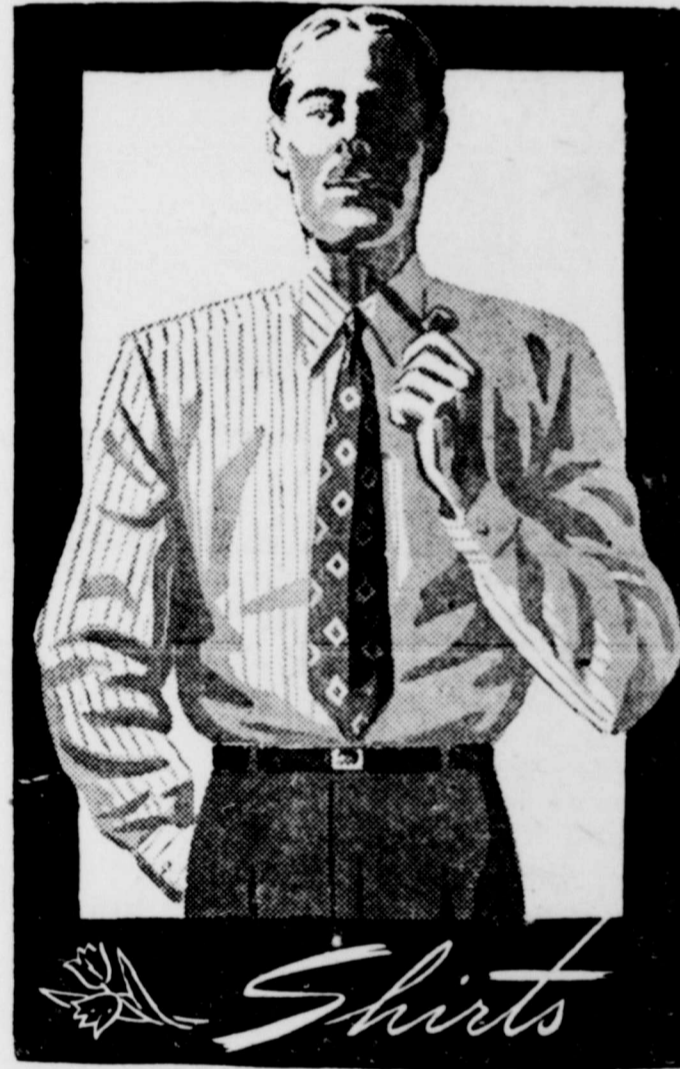
