# P.T.A. Sponsoring



The Summer Round-Up of the children is a health project spon sored by the National Congress of Parents and Teachers through is local units to arouse the interest of parents in improving the health of children entering school for the first time. It also aims to bring about continuous medical and dental supervision of children of all ages. especially those who are apparently healthy. It is carried on in cooperation with the community medical and nursing professions.

In 1925 the National Congress of Parents and Teachers inaugurated the Summer Round-Up of the children in the belief that the home. which is responsible for the health of the preschool child, can make no greater contribution to the school than to send a pupil physically ready to take full advantage of the opportunities that education has to offer. The Summer Round-Up not only brings about correction of defects and immunization against communicable diseases, but it provides a medium for giving parents valuable instruction in child health.





#### Jellied Vegetable Medley

1 package lime-flavored gelatin; 2 chicken bouillon cubes; 1 cup hot water; ½ cup vegetable liquid; 2 tablespoons vinegar; 1/2 teaspoon grated onion; 1 tablespoon pimento strips; 1/2 cup thinly sliced celery; 1/3 cup mayonnaise or salad dressing; 1/2 cup cooked peas or string beans; 1 cup cooked rice\*; 1/4 teaspoon celery salt.

Dissolve lime-flavored gelatin and bouillon cubes in hot water. Ac vegetable liquid, vinegar, and onion. Measure ½ cup, add 2 tablespoons water, and chill until slightly thickened. Fold in pimento and half of the celery. Turn into 1½-quart mold. Chill until firm.

Add 2 tablespoons water to remaining lime-flavored gelatin and chill un'il slightly thickened. Place in bowl of ice and water and whip with rotary egg beater until fluffy and thick like whipped cream. Fold in mayonnaise, then remaining ingredients. Season to taste with salt. Turn onto firm gelatin in mold. Chill until firm. Unmold on salad greens. Makes 6 servings. \* One package pre-cooked




