## In Car Accident

In miedical terms, rheumatic fev-
er fits more closely, perhaps, than any other infectious disease into the "proceed with caution" category
of road repairs. Most other diseases

A long best, rheumatic fever means a long period of careful watching or hazards that may suddenly ap-
pear. One slight attack never means that the germ has been whipped; it only means the germ or germs may
come back at any time with renewed fervor.
Medical science has not yet dis Medical science has not yet dis-
covered what causes rheumatic fev-
er, the disease that strikes most often at 4 to 15 year-olds but may appear at practically any age. There
are many theories as to the possible are many theories as to the possible
onset of the first attack of the dis-
ease but none hold true in the maease but none hold true in the ma-
jority of cases and research goes on to try to unravel the secret. many following attacks of the dis ease seem to be linked with strep
tococcic infections in the nose or throat, so that only recently doctors have found in many cases they
can prevent those infections by con stant dosage with sulfa drugs and
avoid the second and third avoid the second and third at
tacks. Such is the nature of the
disease that the damage it can do disease that the damage it can do
seems to become greater with each attack.
If rheumatic fever could be easi ly recognized, it wouldn't be pos
sible for the disease to do so much harm in the first place. Growing pains such as aching joints are sup
posedly the most common symptom of rheumatic fever, but event thi
of
signal of disease is not always pres signal of disease is not always pres-
ent. The aches are present, shift ing from different parts of the body
in what is called a migratory arthritis, when the millions of string that hold you together are affected
by the spread of the disease through by the spread of the disease through
the body. These strings, such as the body. nese strings, such as
ligaments and tendons and the like,
swell and fail to function properly because the fluids that keep them pliable change from their natural
state into a harder, stringy mass.
Sometimes these "masses" can be seen as little knobs around the joints that hurt; they last a few
days then disappear, possibly showdays then disappear, possibly show
ing up again in another joint that ing up agai
is painful.
Though the pain of such affect
ed joints may be quite intense, it is ed joints may be quite intense, it is
not the joints which are permanent not the joints which are permanent
ly damaged as a result of the acute attacks of rheumatic fever; the heatr is the most likely

from closing properly, permitting the blood to still seep, seep through
into the other chamber. Your docinto the other chamber. Your doc-
tor can hear the sound of that leak
of blood, he knows which trap door blood, he knows which trap door
most likely to be affected, and from other signs of changes in the
body he can tell whether it was body he can tell whether it was
due to rheumatic fever or to somehing else.
As the. acute phase of rheumatic
fever disappears, those wart-like fever disappears, those wart-like
growths usually, shrink into that
trap door, permanently
changing the shape of the flap and throwing
it out of shape. With new attacks it out of shape. With new attacks
of the disease, the flap gets more and more out of shape until it may become so deformed as to not func-
tion at all. tion at all.

heumatic fever though there are many other paths it may cut and create serious damage. Since is may
progress through the body so slow progress through the body so slow-
ly that its presence is not made y that its presence is not made evi-
dent. the regular health check-up for all youngsters should by all
means be continued through teen means be continued through teen
age. A doctor who checks your A doctor who checks your
child regularly will know if any change in the child may be a signal of rheumatic fever.
There is nothing specific, aside health, that you can do to keep a child, from having rheumatic fever,
But there is much your doctor can But there is much your doctor can
do to prevent its making an invalid do to prevent its making an invalid

IN A HISTORIC DECISION, the the conviction of the 11 Communist throw the United States governconstant confusion regarding the legal status of American communists and what could be done about
them without bumping into constitutional road blocks. The opinion written by the Su-
preme Court does not make it illegal for a person to be a member
of the Communist party, but it does make it a violation for such party members to conspire together by
mords and deeds with words and deeds with a design to
overthrow the government by force or viorence.
Heretofore the courts have been hampered by some Supreme Court decisions regarding the rights of in-
dividuals who were communists Only a few years ago an attempt
was made to deport Harry Bridges, the West Coast left-wing labor leader on the ground that he was
an undesirable alien. A tremendous amount of evidence was collected
pointing to his communist status, and the Attorney General ordered
him sent back to his native Austrahia. But the Supreme Court nulli-
fied the order and Bridges was released, much to the elation of the
CIO and other organizations C1O and other organizations that
fought to keep him here.
Bridges was then given itizenBridges was then given citizen-
ship. But two years ago, as a re-
sult of a collection of incriminating sult of a collection of incriminating
evidence collected by Congressional committees and from other sour-
ces, the Department of Justice obtained an indictment against Bridg.
es for perjury, claiming he lied when he swore he was not a Communist at the time his citizenship
was granted. A jury convicted him and the case is now on appeal.
AN UNFORTUNATE THING about the case of the elo penalties
munists is the very low meted out to them. Their prison
sentences were up to five years and sentences were up to five years and
fines of $\$ 10,000$ to each. They should be executed or put away for life.
I plan to introduce a bill to provide much higher penalties for such
treasonable acts when and if others are convicted in the future. The effect of the Supreme Court
ruling should be very helpful in future prosecutions of this charac-
ter. It will put the fear of God in every communist who collaborates
with his fellow-travelers to destroy our government. And it will discourage the millions of Communist
sympathizers who blather about civil rights and constitutional rights
