Our WASHINGTON Letter

MOST OF THE PEOPLE in the 21st district believe we cannot "go it alone" in the struggle against world communism. They believe overwhelmingly that further communist expansion in the Far East and in Europe would endanger American security here at home. Ninety percent of them approve American participation in the Atlantic Pact and the joint defense under General Eisenhower.

These reactions are disclosed in the more than 12,000 responses to the questionnaires which I recently sent to the people in our 27-county district.

More than 25% of those to whom polls were sent returned them, several thousand with interesting and revealing comments. This is probably the highest percentage of responses ever recorded in a Congressional polling operation of this nature. The average, I am told, runs 10 to 15 percent.

PMA PAYMENTS TO FARMERS and ranchmen to help pay for certain range practices would be substantially reduced if the pollsters had their way about it. On that issue the vote was 76% for reduction, 20% against, and 4% with no opinion. In a further break-down by occupation, the tabulation reveals that among farmers and ranchmen 72% favor the PMA reduction, 25% oppose, and 3% have no opinion. In occupations other than ranching and farming, the score was 77% for, 17% against and 6% with no opinion.

Answers to the first two questions reveal numbers of modified answers, many pointing out that military considerations were involved which called for expert judgment.

By questions, here are the results:

1. Do you favor an amendment to the Constitution removing from the President the exclusive authority which the constitution now gives him for making appointments and replacements of military Field Commanders? Yes—53% No—43%
2. Do you subscribe to General MacArthur's proposal that there be (1) intensification of our economic blockade against China and the imposition of a naval blockade against the China coast; (2) removal of restrictions on air reconnaissance of China's coastal areas and of Manchuria; and (3) removal of restric-

State Highway Patrol Positions Open

AUSTIN, June 21—Homer Garrison, Jr., Director of the Texas Department of Public Safety, announced today that the closing date for receiving applications for appointment as Texas Highway Patrolmen is July 10.

Young men who are citizens of the United States and who have resided in Texas for at least one year immediately preceding the date of their application and who are between the ages of 21 and 35 years, inclusive, with a minimum height of 5 feet, 8 inches; and who meet the other necessary physical and character qualifications may secure application blanks from their nearest Texas Highway Patrol District Office or by writing directly to W. J. Elliott, Chief, Texas Highway Patrol, at Austin.

Garrison pointed out that the Patrol offers excellent advantages in working conditions to young Texans who are interested in career law enforcement.

Applicants who successfully pass the exhaustive character investigation and field examinations will be thoroughly schooled at the Department's headquarters in Austin early this fall before assignment to duty posts over the state.

LOCAL OFFICES GIVEN NEW AUTHORITY IN WAGE MATTERS

FORT WORTH, June 21—Extension of the authority of the Wage-Hour Division of the U.S. Department of Labor in matters of wage and salary stabilization was announced here today by P.D. Riley, supervisor of the Fort Worth Wage-Hour office.

Beginning on June 25, he said, his office in the BurkBurnett Building and the other Wage-Hour offices over the country will receive and examine petitions for action by the National Wage Stabilization Board. The Board in Washington also has authorized such local offices to make investigations of violations of Wage Stabilization regulations, he revealed.

"Field offices of the Labor Department's Wage-Hour Division have been answering inquiries on wage stabilization since early this year," he said, "but until now they have not been authorized to make investigations, and all petitions for special consideration by the Board were sent to Washington."

In the matter of investigations, the Wage-Hour offices now are authorized to do fact finding into the records and books of parties concerned and to make reports of such findings to the WSB staff in Washington.

Town To Be Sprayed Saturday

Plans are being mapped out for the initial spraying of Sterling City for fly control. If wind conditions are suitable, the first spraying will be done Saturday, June 23.

We are asking that all of the citizens leave their homes open so that the spray may drift through the house. This spray is harmless. The only caution you should observe is to keep food well covered, because the spray material is toxic. This material will kill ants, flies, mosquitos, cockroaches, and clothes moths if it can get to them.

It is advisable also to move your automobile to avoid it being sprayed. If a rosin base is used in the spray, it will cause paint damage.

The spray which will be used is 2½ percent DDT and 2 percent chlordane with a sticker base. It is to be applied with a turbine spray operated by Enochs Bros.

In order that an effective program be carried out against flies and mosquitos, each family in Sterling City must cooperate in reducing breeding places.

Sanitation should be the primary measure in fly control. Insecticides are almost useless unless fly-breeding places are eliminated. Trash should be burned or otherwise destroyed; garbage or other such matter should be sprayed.

DDT remains one of the best insecticides. A 5 percent DDT residual oil spray should be used about the house. A 5 percent DDT emulsion or wettable powder spray is favored for barns and other out-buildings. If DDT appears to be unsatisfactory, either a 2 percent chlordane or a combination spray containing 2½ percent DDT and 2 percent chlordane should give good results.

Remember: the watchword for insect control is sanitation.

Concrete Fuel Oil Tank

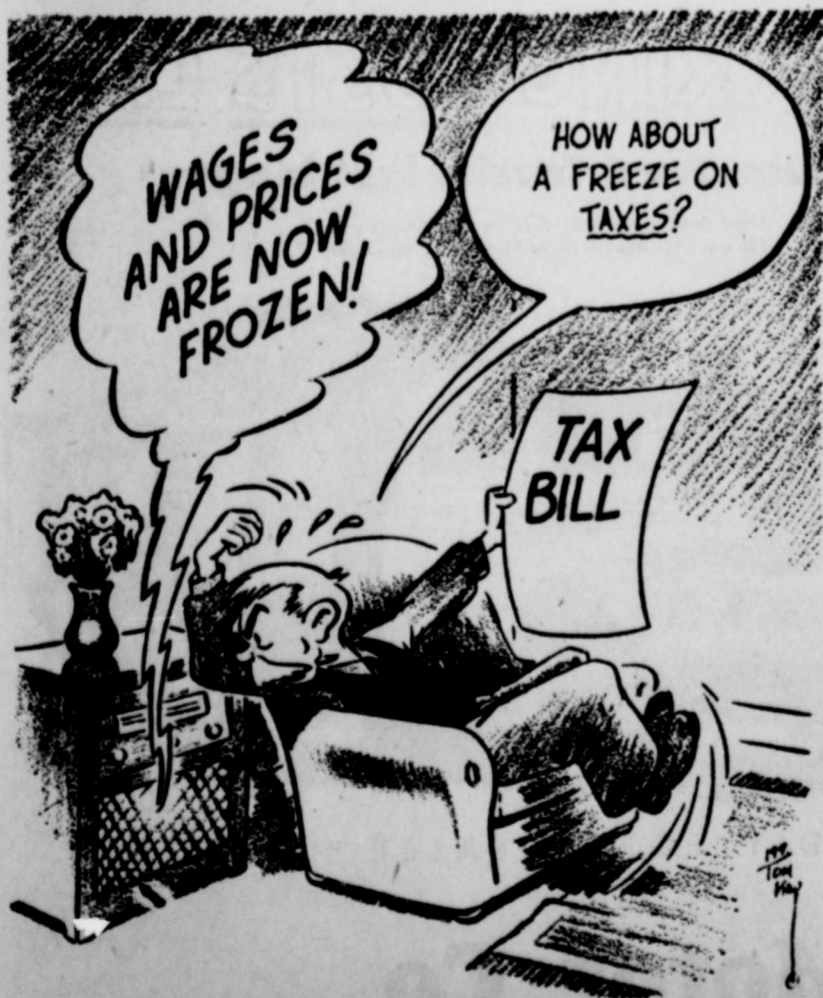
An all-concrete underground fuel oil storage tank for private homes has been developed. The spherical tank has no seams other than the cover, holds 600 gallons and is about 5½ feet high. The manufacturer says the tank will last forever because it will not rust. Large concrete storage tanks have been used for several years by oil companies and by the Navy.

The federal gasoline tax of 1½ cents per gallon now costs taxpayers more each year than the total tax receipts of the national government from all sources 35 years ago.

The oil industry produced almost four billion gallons of gasoline in December 1950—more than it did during the entire year of 1918.

On a tonnage basis, the movement of crude oil and petroleum products accounts for about 65 percent of the nation's ocean shipping and 35 percent of the traffic on its inland waterways.

HEALTH TALKS

Besides the plantlife that sometimes besets man and creates infectious diseases, there are animal-life "things" that have a way of getting under or through your hide and creating various assortments of disorders.

Mosquitos are responsible for two diseases that get under your hide by way of the mosquito bite and eventually end up in the blood stream. There is only one particular brand of mosquito, the Anopheles, which carries malaria while there are four different mosquito families, including the Anopheles, that are responsible for filariasis.

Strict control of mosquito breeding places definitely pays off when the Anopheles mosquito moves into an area. You can't tell the difference between this and other mosquitos unless you've studied insect life, so ordinarily such control is left up to government agencies such as the sanitation agency and the health agency in your area. They have individuals who are constantly on the alert for the brands of mosquito which can spread diseases; when such mosquitos are found, their breeding places must be cleaned out for the protection of population over a wide area. Pot-bellied minnows are considered the best agent for the removal of mosquitos after the marsh, pool, puddle or pond has been cleaned enough for the minnows to have free access to all parts of the water, especially around the banks.

With such a program of sanitation, malaria has become a much rarer disease than it was in the past. Filariasis is extremely rare in this country; cleaning out mosquito-breeding places will keep it so.

It takes more than a mosquito to spread either of these diseases, however; those special kinds of mosquitos have to feed upon someone with either malaria or filariasis and become infected before they can pass the disease on to someone else. That is why a person afflicted with either of those diseases owes it not only to himself but to his whole community to be treated for the diseases and to observe utmost caution that no mosquito feeds upon him.

When the mosquito bites a person with the disease, the "skeeter" gets so chockful of infection that sinking his long nose into another person transmits the disease; it's there in his nose. With malaria, the mosquito transmits a form of animal life known as protozoa; with filariasis, the mosquito transmits the disease by way of a threadlike white worm.

With malaria, that protozoa from the mosquito latches on to the red cells of the blood stream and eventually causes those cells to burst open, ruining the cell but freeing the protozoa to find other red cells. When a great many of those red cells through the body are bursting open, you have the typical picture of malaria; shaking chills, high fever, and then drenching sweat.

All malaria cases do not follow the same pattern, of course, but

that is the most common pattern of the disease. That trio of symptoms of chills, fever, and sweat may be repeated twice a day, daily, every two days or every three days, usually setting up a definite pattern.

There are four different types of protozoa each of which causes a different brand of malaria, some rather slight cases and some very serious. By an examination of your blood, your doctor can tell which type of malaria you have. Sometimes the disease affects the head, sometimes it invades the digestive tract, and sometimes it creates damage in the chest. When the most obvious sign of the disease is a cold, clammy skin and a state of shock, it is called algid malaria; when the disease creates headaches and dizziness with a yellowish tinge to the skin, it is called bilious malaria.

Filariasis is not as well known around the world as its chief complication is. Elephantiasis, the tremendous swelling of leg, arm, breast or scrotum, has achieved wide notoriety as a tropical condition. Though some of the servicemen stationed in the tropics during the war were afflicted with the worm-infestation of the blood and lymph channels known as filariasis, it is not anticipated that they shall ever develop elephantiasis because elephantiasis seems to result

only from repeated infections from mosquitos which carry the worm of the disease. Studies of the disease at the present indicate that it takes a period of ten years of repeated infection to lead to the deformities of elephantiasis.

There are other worm diseases which are quite common in this country. Hookworm, pinworm, round worm and tapeworm are perhaps the most common, locating for the most part in the digestive tract. Hookworm, of course, is picked up through the skin, usually by bare feet trodding upon the worm itself. The other worm diseases are more often the result of undercooked meats, including fish, improperly washed vegetables; a contaminated water supply or some such lack of strict sanitation and cleanliness.

There is no definite way you might suspect the presence of worms; they may cause all sorts of symptoms or they may cause none at all. They may lead to serious damage or none at all. Your doctor can usually tell from a blood test and an examination of the contents of the bowel whether any species of worms could be causing trouble; when he suggests such examinations as part of a physical check-up, it usually means he has found some sign someplace that only those tests can tell for sure whether he is right or wrong.

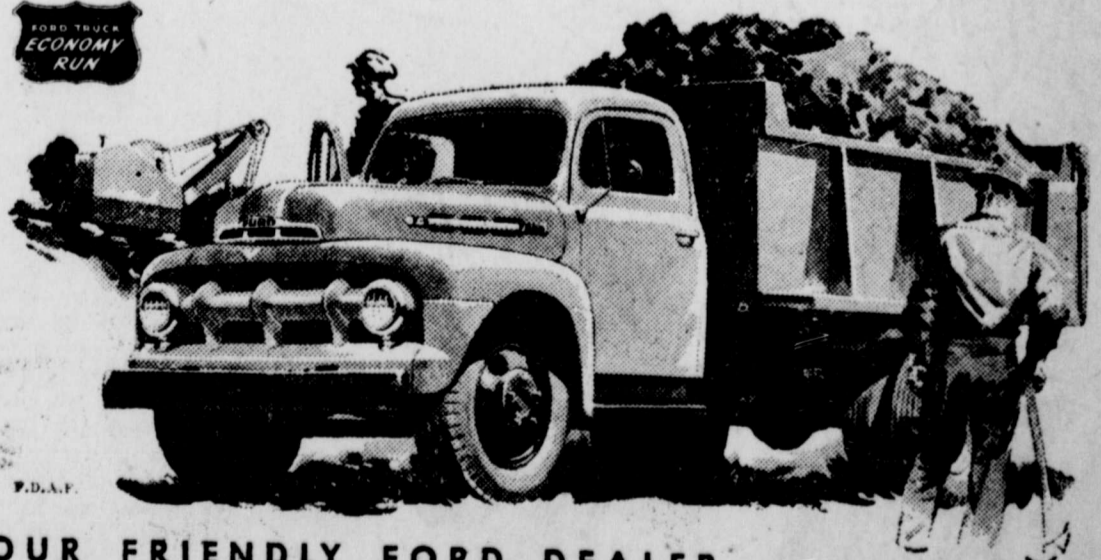

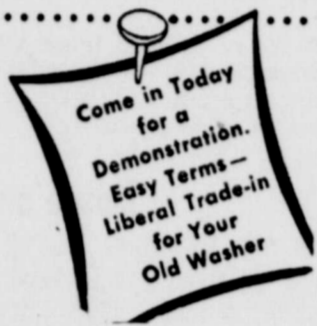

Got spring fever? Well you can still be a lazybones and yet have a scrumptious cake like the one pictured above. Instant cake mix is your friend these lazy days as it takes no effort at all to mix up one of these downy-textured, tender cakes. Tart red jelly between the layers, fluffy whipped cream on top — who would guess you hadn't spent all day in the kitchen?

Spring Cake

1 package white cake mix
½ cup milk and ½ cup milk

1 cup tart red jelly
½ cup cream, whipped and sweetened

Turn cake mix into bowl. Add ½ cup milk. Blend, then beat 2 minutes. Add ½ cup milk. Blend,

then beat one minute longer. (Beat cake vigorously by hand or at a low speed of electric mixer.)

Turn batter into two round 8-inch layer pans, which have been lined on bottoms with paper. Bake in moderate oven (375° F.) 20 to 25 minutes. Cool. Split each layer in half. Spread jelly between layers and cover top of cake with whipped cream.

Glass Bottles Cause Grass Fires

Glass bottles lying along the roadside or in pastures are a major cause of grass fires, according to an article in the Farm and Ranch magazine. Acting as a magnifying glass when the sun's rays reach the proper angle, almost any bottle may concentrate the heat of the sun sufficiently to ignite dry grass.

Insurance adjusters have frequently suspected that many fires blamed on matches and cigarettes dropped by passing motorists should have been charged to a bottle found in the center of the burned area. However, little attention has been given to this source of fires, and it is not uncommon to see literally dozens of bottles scattered along the road side and even on pastures and in woodlots.

Evidence that this is a major fire hazard is found in the experience of farmers in McLennan County, Texas. Fire bugs had been suspected of setting frequent grass fires along Highway 6, but the discovery of a bottle in the center of one of the burned areas stimulated a clean-up campaign by the farmers along the highway. Pastures and roadsides were cleared of all bottles, and the grass fires were practically eliminated.

There is sufficient evidence that bottles can start grass fires to warrant a thorough clean-up campaign on the part of farmers and ranchers. Such a program may be a major step in reducing the number of destructive grass fires.

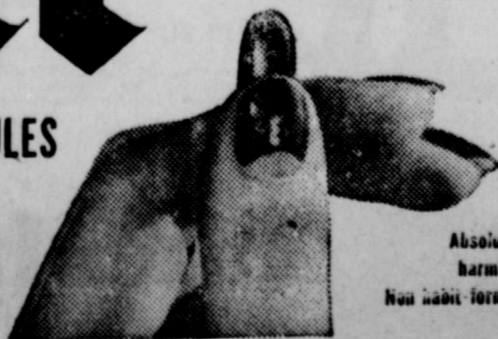

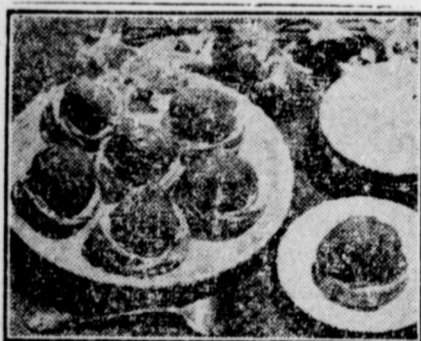

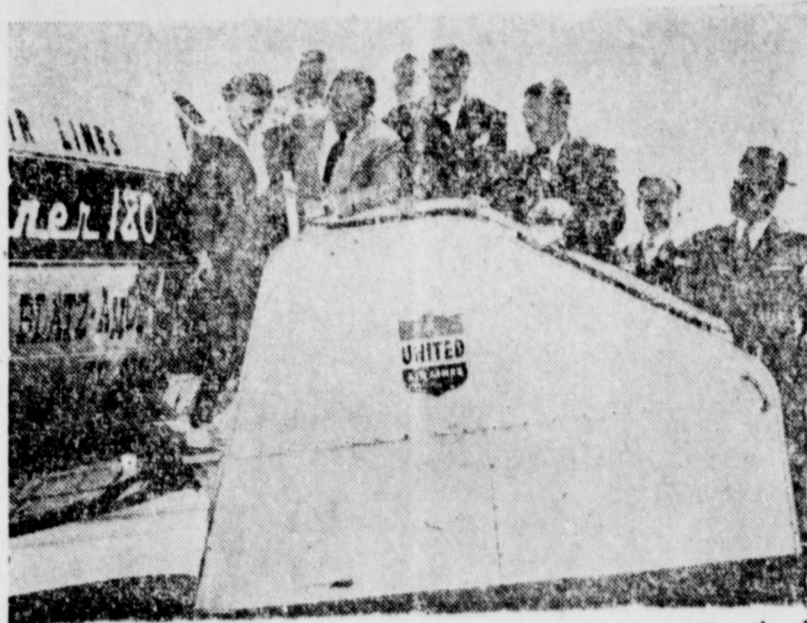

Sherbet in Meringue Cups
 1 cup milk
 1 cup water
 1 package sherbet mix

Measure milk and water into bowl. Add contents of package. Beat with rotary beater until dissolved — about 2 minutes. Pour mixture into refrigerator tray and place in freezing compartment. When mixture is firmly frozen, remove from tray to bowl. Break up into small lumps with fork or potato masher. Beat with electric or rotary beater until free from lumps but still a thick mush. Return to refrigerator tray and place in freezing compartment until fairly firm. If frozen too hard, place in refrigerator just below freezing compartment to soften. When ready to serve, fill meringues with a generous scoop of sherbet. Garnish with fresh fruit if desired.

Meringues: Combine 4 egg whites, 1 teaspoon cream of tartar and 1/2 teaspoon salt and beat until stiff. Gradually add 1 cup sugar. Beat until mixture forms stiff peaks, but is not dry. Using pastry bag, pipe mixture onto brown paper on cookie sheet to form round cups about 3 inches in diameter. Bake at 250° F. for one hour or until surface is dry and slightly browned. Cool. When ready to serve, fill center of cups with generous scoop of sherbet.

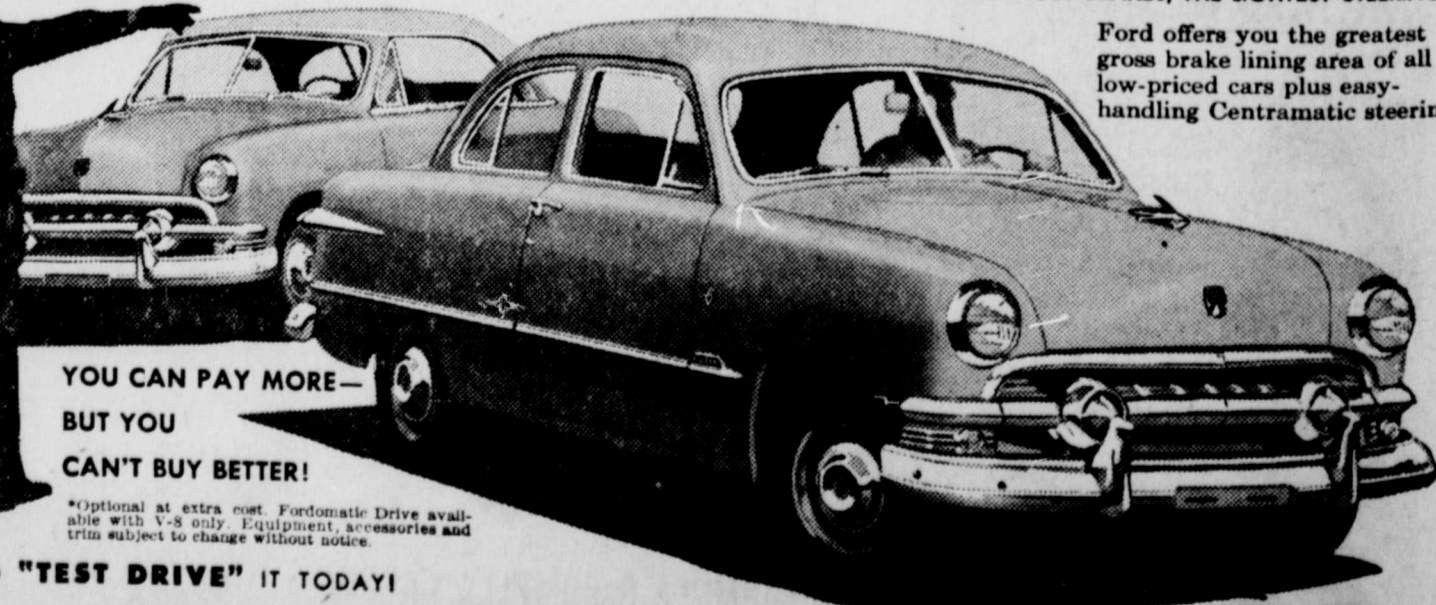

Pen-Type Dairy Barns Lower Cost

As dairy farmers look for additional ways of reducing production costs and increasing efficiency, they should consider the use of "pen-type housing." This type of housing means a sheltered, bedded area where the cows run loose and an enclosed milking parlor where the cows are milked while they eat their concentrate.

The pen-type housing can be built for much less cost than the conventional type barn. Secondly, and probably more important, is the saving in labor costs. If the work is carefully planned, the labor required to care for a dairy cow can be reduced almost one half.

In addition to lower construction costs and increased labor efficiency, which are possible in pen-type barns, there are several other advantages, including:

- 1—Greater comfort and freedom for the cow.
- 2—Few udder and teat injuries.
- 3—More and better quality manure is produced.
- 4—The use of the pen-type barn is more flexible in that it can be more easily adapted for other livestock in the event the farm organization is changed.

As with everything, there are disadvantages to the pen-type system. For example, there may be a boss cow which becomes a nuisance and a timid cow may be afraid to eat or lie down. De-horning, or occasionally removing an offending cow from the herd, will usually solve this problem. The pen barn requires much more bedding than the stanchion barn.

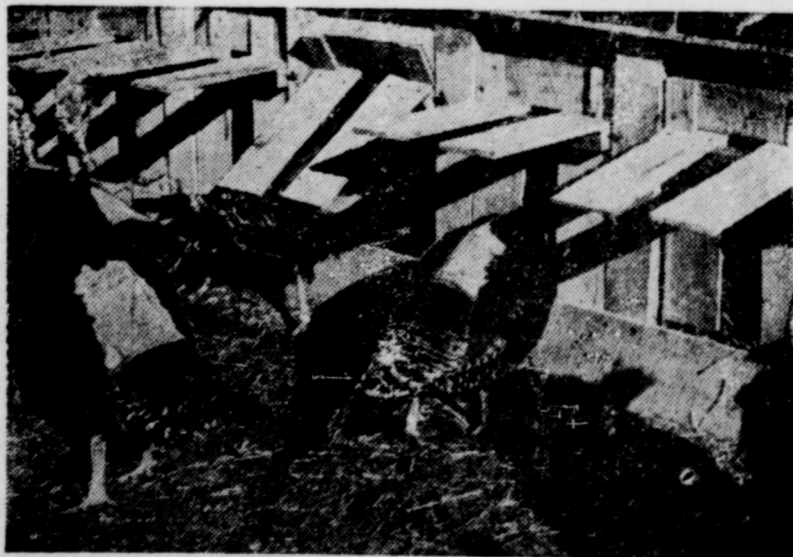
Dairymen interested in a pen-type housing program should talk with farmers who are using the system successfully.

Breed Dairy Heifers By Weight—Not Age

Many dairymen have calving troubles in heifers even though they don't breed heifers until they are 15 to 18 months old. These calving difficulties are usually not due to the size of the bull or the age when the heifers are bred. The trouble is more often because of small heifers that have not been properly grown out.

Regardless of how old a heifer may be when bred, there is reason to expect difficulty at calving time if she was small and unthrifty at breeding time. Too many heifers have had to live on pasture alone or they have

These Hens Lay in Private



A turkey hen entering one of these nests closes a door behind her. She can get out, but other hens can't get in to disturb her. C. E. Buitt of Flemington, Missouri, who uses these nest fronts with his breeder flock, says he can't prove his hens lay any more eggs because of them, but he's sure they break fewer of them. The nests are counter-balanced and swing on a pivot. When the hen puts her head through the slot, a little pressure from her shoulders opens the door to let her in.

HOME OWNERS QUESTION BOX

Q—My kitchen sink edge is covered with aluminum, and when I stand against it my apron and dress front gets black. How can this be prevented?

A—Liquid wax, applied periodically, is recommended. If clothing still becomes discolored from contact with the sink edge, you might try roughing up the aluminum with steel wool and then applying shellac.

Q—I have been unable to find a small leak in my roof. How can I locate it?

A—Examine the under side of the roof in bright daylight. When you find the spot where light shows through, put a piece of wire or a sliver of wood through the hole so it can be located from outside. If your roof is worn, however, other leaks can be expected to develop shortly and it would be economical to put on a new roof rather than to attempt to patch the old one. Asphalt shingles usually can be applied right over the old roofing material.

Q—Some of the windows in my home are difficult to open and then, once opened, require considerable effort to close. What causes this, and how can the condition be overcome?

A—There are several causes of sticking windows. Hardened paint in the grooves in which the window slides may be responsible, and swelling of the sashes or parts of the grooves is another cause. The sash can be made to slide more easily, however, by rubbing paraffin on the

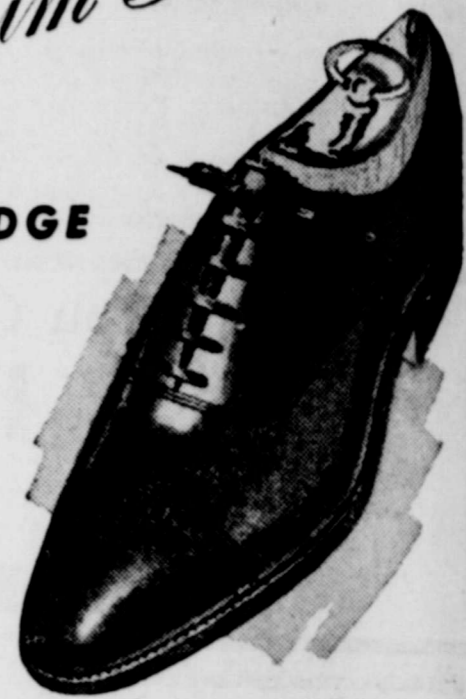
