Now that's what you have to work with to start on mental and physical health. Everyone is supposed to have those 24 pair of genes, the gift of ancestors going back we know not how far.

For about nine months those genes develop under the mother's power, with the air the mother breathes and the food she eats creating the power for the genes. Those strings of genes start swinging around like the spokes of a wheel, and as they swing they grow longer, creating physical characteristics of the body.

Then comes birth and the child up his own power plant by breath-

Suppose some of those genes were reserved strictly for mental activity. They haven't started swinging in a very wide circle yet. but don't forget that all those genes, both mental and physical, have a common beginning; they were all tied

at one end when they started out So the action of those physical genes reacts upon the knot which Templeton Foster, Mr. and Mrs. These mental genes, or spokes, start Foster Conger, Mrs. Sterling Foster, swinging out too more or less followed. ical spokes. If a physical spoke (you can imagine that is a nerve or a muscle) comes in contact with something pleasant, then the mental spoke "registers" that the thing the physical spoke touched was good. If the physical spoke touches something that hurts, then the mental spoke records that as something to be avoided.

As time goes by, those mental spokes have a recording of many goods and bads, all things that af fect the child. But somewhere along the way the child discovers that the things he does also affect other people. So he starts becoming aware of another "wheel" made up of other people who affect him and whom he affects.

So while his physical development goes on, he mentally pictures a new world, a world of other people who have feelings and actions like him

Then one day the child runs smack dab into the table. He treat it as if it were another person but gets no reaction. A few instances like that and the child decides his world is made up not only of himself and other people but "things" as well, all of which affect him.



### Simply Peachy

PEACHES are a universal favorite and still abundant and inexpensive. What more delightful way to show off



their beauty and usher out the summer season than in this delicious Peach Cream Pie? An easy-to-prepare base, made with vanilla pudding

and pie filling mix, calls for slices of juicy, ripe peaches, used generously as a garnish. For special occasions, try adding an unbaked meringue topping to give it that "something extra" that makes a party.

Peach Cream Pie

1 package vanilla pudding and pie filling mix; 1 egg yolk, slightly beaten; 2 cups milk; 1 baked 8-inch pie shell; unbaked Meringue; fresh peach slices.

Place packaged pudding in saucepan. Combine egg yolk and milk; add to ple filling mix gradually, blending well. Cook and stir, over medium heat until mixture comes to a boil and is thickened. Cool slightly (about 5 minutes), stirring once or twice. Turn into pie shell. Chill. Pile Unbaked Meringue around edge of pie, if de-sired. Garnish with peach slices.

Unbaked Meringue: Combine 1 unbeaten egg white, ¼ cup sugar, a dash of salt, and 1½ tablespoons water in top of double boiler; beat with rotary egg beater until thoroughly mixed. Place over rapidly boiling water and Then remove from heat and continue beating 1 minute longer, or until mixture will stand in peaks. Add 1/4 teaspoon vanilla. Pile lightly



as the saying goes in Franceacross-the-sea. On this side of the ocean we say "Everybody to his own taste." But a family taste test will give a happy vote of approval to this recipe for Frozen Crunch, a delightful new cooler that is as refreshing as a sea breeze itself. It's a mixture of ice cream, nut meats, and the new candy-coated rice cereal that lends itself so well to recipes:

Frozen Crunch

2 tablespoons butter

1/3 cup chopped nut meats cup brown sugar, firmly packed 2 cups candy-coated rice cereal,

Dash of salt 2 teaspoons gelatin 1/4 cup cold water cups hot milk

1/2 cup sugar Dash of salt 1 cup cream, whipped

1 teaspoon vanilla Melt butter in skillet over low heat. Add nut meats and brown lightly. Add brown sugar and cook, stirring constantly, until sugar melts and cara-

melizes slightly. Add cereal and salt; mix well. Cool and crumble. Combine gelatin and cold water; mix well. Add hot milk and stir until gelatin is dissolved. Add sugar and salt and mix well. Chill until slightly thickened. Then fold in whipped

cream and vanilla. Turn into freezing tray of automatic refrigerator, setting control for coldest freezing temperature. When partially frozen, turn into a chilled bowl and beat with rotary egg beater until fluffy and smooth. Fold in % of the cereal mixture. Return to tray and freeze 30 minutes longer; stir. Then sprinkle remaining cereal mix-ture over the top and freeze until firm. Freezing time: 3 to 4 hours. Makes 1 quart.

You can even European-ize this interesting treat: for Mock Biscuit Tortoni, simply turn the ice cream and cereal mixture into 4- or 6-ounce paper cups. Top them with the remaining cereal mixture and freeze them until firm. This makes 12 to 16 servings.






