

Use the open kettle method for jams, preserves, relishes and pickles, but this method is not a reliable one for canning fruits and tomatoes.



Workmen's Compensation Insurance for em-ployees of cities, towns and villages"; and "AGAINST the Constitutional Amend-ment authorizing the Legislature to provide for Workmen's Compensation Insurance for employees of cities, towns and villages." Each voter shall mark out one (1) of said clauses on the ballot, leaving the one (1) expressing his vote on the proposed Amend-ment; and if it shall appear from the re-turns of said election that a majority of the votes cast are in favor of said Amendment, the same shall become a par. of the Con-stitution of the State of Texas. Sec. 3. The Governor of the State of Texas shall assue the necessary proclamation for said election and have the same published as required by the Constitution and laws of this State.

The Legislature shall create a State Medical Education Board to be com-posed of not more than six (6) members whose qualifications, duties and terms of office shall be prescribed by law.
