Up to one inch of rain fell in the county Tuesday afternoon and evening. The fall was heavier in some sections of the county than others.



Sterling County voters went to the polls Tuesday and gave the popular Republican nominee a vote of 277 to Stevenson's 158. This vote of nearly two to one was the first time Sterling County had ever gone Republican. But, along with Texas and the nation as a whole, Sterling Countians went for "Ike".

Shivers got 69 votes for governor as a Republican and 306 as a Democrat. Senator-elect Price Daniel received 336 Demo votes and 93 Republican votes in the cross filing.

Both state constitutional amendments were defeated as far as the Sterling voters were concerned. On the workman's compensation one, there were 133 against to 89 for; and the medical education fund had 142 against and 84 for.

Indications all along had pointed to a victory for Ike and Nixon, but the showing of nearly two to one exceeded hopes of those backing the Republican nominees."



Beat egg whites until foamy through-out. Add 3 tablespoons sugar gradually and continue beating until mix-ture will stand in soft peaks. Fold in hot pudding. Turn into 9x9x2-inch serving dish. Chill. Arrange 9 of the cookies on top and spread with whipped cream. Crush remaining cookies thoroughly and sprinkle the crumbs on the whipped cream. Chill 1 hour longer. Cut in squares. Gar-nish with mint leaves and maraschino cherries, if desired. Makes 9 servings.



Melt chocolate and butter over hot water. Combine sugar and syrup in saucepan. Bring to a boil over high heat, stirring until sugar is dissolved. Boil 2 minutes. Add chocolate mixture. Pour slowly over eggs, stirring constantly. Add vanilla and nuts, stirring to mix well. Turn into unbaked pie shell. Bake in moderate oven (375° F.) 45 to 50 minutes, or until pie is puffed completely across top. Cool. Top with whipped cream.
