San Angelo office of the Social Security Administration. enters its seventeenth year of op.
eration, Clark says, over five mil erion people are receiving $\$ 200$ mil-
lion in insurance lion in insurance payments each
month. The total paid in 1953 to these retired workers, their famil-
ies, and to dependent survivors deceased workers who were insured In the past sixteen years, Clark
believes, American families have believes, American families have
built up more protection under
Federal old-age and Federal old-age and survivors in-
surance than they generally realize. For example, $80 \%$ of all realize For example, $80 \%$ of all jobs in
the country are covered by the piogram, and 62 million persons are
now insured for benefits now insured for benefits on the ba-
sis of their employment in covered work. Twenty-three million of
these are permanently insured Four out of five mothers and child-
ren in the United States are proren in the United States are pro-
tected under the Federal program in case of the death of the family breadwinner. The total face value
of the life insurance protection un of the life insurance protection un-
derwritten by the system is over derwritten
$\$ 275$ billion.
