100,000 people. If Hawaii is admitted, it will be
the firist time in American history
that a new state has been brought that a new state has been brought
into the unicn where the majority of the people were not members of
the Caucasian race. This is no re-

wair's population, but it is fact that must be recognized. The bul
of that population is Japanese, Ch nese, and Phillipino, while the Cau

per ent of the total population.
