WHEN the banging of the door announces the arrival of Junior and the "gang," you can bet the first place they'll head for is your kitchen looking for a snack. And there's nothing that will more surely make you the heroine of the afternoon than to have a pleny of milk in the refrigerator and a coosy jar filled to the brim with these crispy Bran Gingersnaps. Cereal makes them substantial enough to satisfy young appetites and also gives them the crunchy texture that kids love.

Bran Gingersnaps.
 1 1/2 cups sifted flour; 1/4 teaspoon salt; 1/2 teaspoon ginger; 1/2 cup molasses; 6 tablespoons butter or other shortening; 1/4 cup brown sugar, firmly packed; 1 1/2 cups 40% Bran Flakes.
 Sift flour once, measure, add salt, and ginger, and sift again. Place molasses, shortening and sugar in saucepan and cook gently 2 minutes; stir constantly. Cool to lukewarm. Add cereal and mix well. Then add flour mixture and mix thoroughly. Chill until firm enough to roll. Roll 1/4 inch thick on lightly floured board. Cut with 1 1/4-inch cookie cutter. Bake on greased baking sheet and bake in moderate oven (350° F.) 10 minutes. Makes 6 dozen gingersnaps.

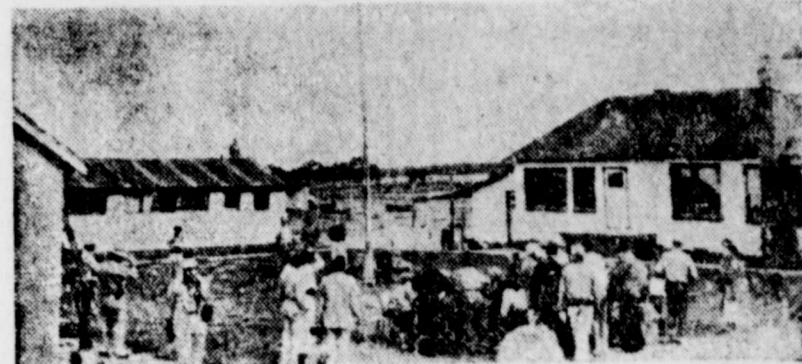

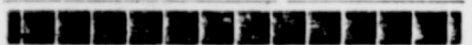

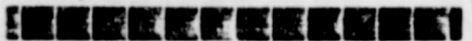

when you know how! And the "know-how" in making this luscious Lemon Angel Cake is lemon pudding and pie filling mix. The pudding, made in a jiffy, gives that real lemon flavor to the frosting and when combined with the other ingredients listed below provides a fluffy golden topping for an angel cake.

Lemon Angel Cake
 1 package lemon pudding and pie filling mix; 1½ cups water; 1 egg; ½ cup butter; 1½ cups sifted confectioners' sugar; 10-inch angel food cake.

Combine pudding mix and ¼ cup of water in saucepan. Add whole egg and blend well. Then add remaining 1¼ cups water. Cook and stir until mixture comes to a full boil and is thickened. (This takes about 5 minutes.) Remove from heat. Cool about 5 minutes; stir once or twice. Chill.

Cream butter until soft. Add sugar gradually, blending well after each addition. Add chilled pudding gradually, beating well with rotary egg beater.

Split cake into three layers. Spread frosting between layers and on top and sides of cake. Makes 10 to 12 servings.

FISHER COUNTY FAIR AND RODEO AUGUST 27-28-29

The 1953 Fisher County Fair and Rodeo is open to all neighboring counties of West Texas this year, according to fair officials, and everyone is welcome to enter the annual event.

Friday and Saturday, August 28 and 29 are dates of the fair, with a big rodeo scheduled for August 27-28 and 29. Grades will precede the rodeo the afternoons of August 27 and 29.

Fair divisions are open to the public and include beef cattle show, dairy cattle, swine, horse, field crops and the women's events, which include canning, sewing and cooking exhibits. No poultry show will be held this year.

No entry fees are charged at the Fisher County Fair.

Ribbons will be awarded as prizes for winners of the various divisions in the fair. Approximately \$2,000.00 in prize money will be awarded rodeo winners.

"Fisher County extends a warm welcome to her out-of-the-county friends to enter any event in our 8th Annual Fair and Rodeo," states County Agent Frank L. Crowder, Jr.

Persons interested in entering any division are asked to write to the County Agent, Roby, Texas, for a fair catalogue. No entry blanks are required. Entries will be accepted until Thursday, August 27, 1953.

Monarch Lion Yawns At Traffic Cop



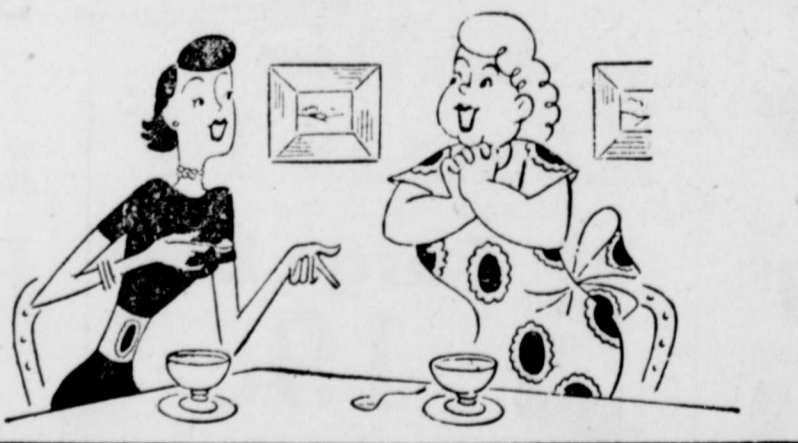

Here's how to make nourishing milk desserts with nonfat dry milk solids. Nonfat dry milk is the magic ingredient in many recipes today. Reliquified milk powder may be used in place of milk for economy. Or, the dry milk solids can be added along with fresh milk as a nutritional supplement.

And for you ladies (and men too) who are in reducing moods, nonfat dry milk is used in many diets. So, why not prepare desserts that are economical and also emphasize the reducing theme? Rennet desserts are excellent in this respect and here you will find complete instructions for preparation.

To use nonfat milk solids in place of whole milk, add 8 to 9 tablespoons of milk powder to 2 cups of water. Mix as directed on the package of milk powder. Then, use in place of milk.

Rennet Dessert
 8-9 tablespoons nonfat dry milk solids
 2 cups water
 1 package rennet powder

Mix dry milk solids with water as directed on package of milk powder. Allow foam to settle.

Set out 4 or 5 dessert glasses. Warm milk slowly until lukewarm, stirring constantly. Test a drop on the inside of your wrist frequently. When it feels comfortably warm (110° F.) not hot, remove at once from heat. Stir in entire contents of package at one time. Mix until powder is dissolved—not over one minute. Pour at once, while still liquid, into dessert glasses. Do not disturb for about 10 minutes, while milk sets. Then chill in refrigerator until serving time.

*If milk gets too hot, cool to comfortably warm before adding rennet powder, or it will not set.

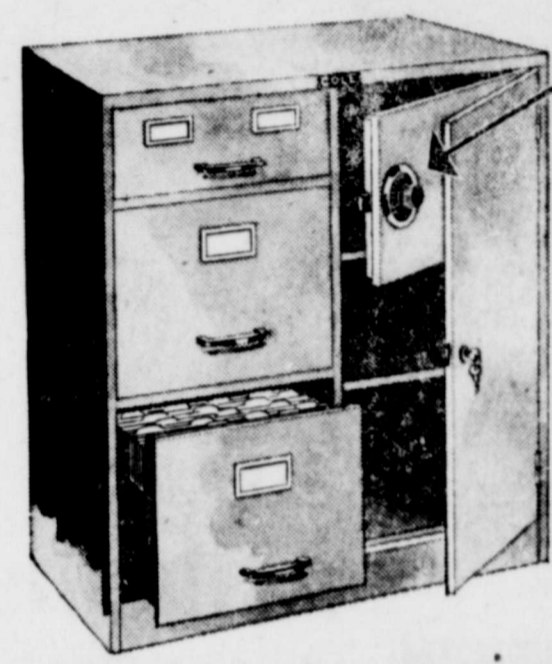
