**Raisin Apple Rennet Custard**

- 1/4 cup chopped raisins
- 1/2 cup thick applesauce
- 2 cups milk (not canned)
- 1 package vanilla rennet powder

Mix raisins and applesauce. Divide  
among 4 dessert glasses. Warm milk  
slowly until lukewarm, stirring con-  
stantly. When comfortably warm  
(110° F.) *not hot*, remove at once from  
heat. *Stir* in entire contents of pack-  
age vanilla rennet powder at one time.  
Mix until powder is dissolved — *not  
over one minute*. Pour at once, *while  
still liquid*, into dessert glasses. Do  
not disturb for about 10 minutes,  
while milk sets. Then chill in refrig-  
erator until serving time. Serve plain  
or with whipped cream.



The pudding, made in a jiffy, gives that real lemon flavor to the frosting and when combined with the other ingredients listed below provides a fluffy golden topping for an angel cake.

**Lemon Angel Cake**

1 package lemon pudding and pie filling mix; 1 1/2 cups water; 1 egg; 1/2 cup butter; 1 1/2 cups sifted confectioners' sugar; 10-inch angel food cake.

Combine pudding mix and 1/4 cup of water in saucepan. Add whole egg and blend well. Then add remaining 1 1/4 cups water. Cook and stir until mixture comes to a full boil and is thickened. (This takes about 5 minutes.) Remove from heat. Cool about 5 minutes; stir once or twice. Chill.

Cream butter until soft. Add sugar gradually, blending well after each addition. Add chilled pudding gradually, beating well with rotary egg beater.

Split cake into three layers. Spread frosting between layers and on top and sides of cake. Makes 10 to 12 servings.

That's the way I feel about kidnapers. Especially the kind that took the little Greenleaf kid and killed him immediately before even trying to get the ransom money.

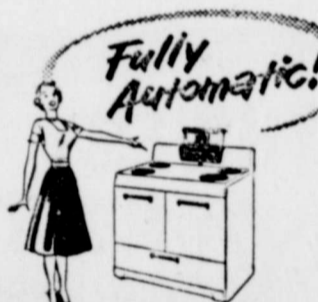

Now that you June brides have settled down to the art of home-making, we thought you would enjoy a few tips on the preparation of quick and economical snacks. So, for that weekend afternoon pickup and for that ever-popular "midnight raid on the ice-box," how about some homemade jam and jelly spreads? Our Grape Jelly recipe is easy to make and so delicious on crackers or on the bread of your choice.

The old adage "The best way to a man's heart is through his stomach" can never be said too often. So avoid in the very beginning the prospect of a grouchy husband. We doubt, with a serving of this delightful and economical grape jelly that any spouse could be very irritable.

Experienced homemakers have learned that jams and jellies are quickly and easily made with natural fruit pectin. This morsel of knowledge we would like to pass on to you young homemakers. So keep a good supply of this homemade jelly in your cupboard, and the problem of what tempting delicacy to serve will be over.

## Grape Jelly

Yield: about 10 medium glasses  
4 cups juice  
7 cups sugar  
½ bottle Certo liquid fruit pectin

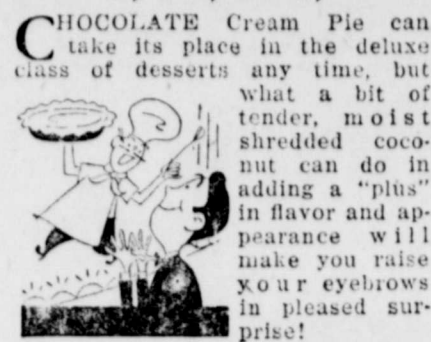
First, prepare the juice. Stem about 3 pounds fully ripe grapes and crush thoroughly. Add ½ cup water; bring to a boil and simmer, covered, 10 minutes. Place in jelly cloth or bag and squeeze out juice. Measure 4 cups into a very large saucepan. Concord grapes give best color and flavor. If wild grapes, Malagas, or other tight-skinned grapes are used, use 2½ cups grape juice and add ¼ cup lemon juice.

Then make the jelly. Add sugar to juice in saucepan and mix well. Place over high heat and bring to a boil, stirring constantly. At once stir in liquid fruit pectin. Then bring to a full rolling boil and boil hard one minute, stirring constantly. Remove from heat, skim off foam with metal spoon, and pour quickly into glasses. Cover jelly at once with ¼ inch hot paraffin.

Spiced Grape Jelly. Add ¼ to 1 teaspoon each cinnamon, ginger and allspice or any desired combination of spices to grapes before simmering.

CHOCOLATE Cream Pie can take its place in the deluxe class of desserts any time, but what a bit of tender, moist shredded coconut can do in adding a "plus" in flavor and appearance will make you raise your eyebrows in pleased surprise!

## Chocolate Coconut Cream Pie

3 squares unsweetened chocolate; 2½ cups milk; 1 cup sugar; 6 tablespoons flour; ½ teaspoon salt; 2 egg yolks, slightly beaten; 2 tablespoons butter or other shortening; 1 teaspoon vanilla; 1 baked 9-inch pie shell.  
2 egg whites; 4 tablespoons sugar; ½ cup shredded coconut.  
Add chocolate to milk and heat in double boiler. When chocolate is melted, beat with rotary egg beater until blended. Combine sugar, flour, and salt; add gradually to chocolate mixture and cook until thickened, stirring constantly; then continue cooking 10 minutes, stirring occasionally. Pour small amount of mixture over egg yolks, stirring vigorously; return to double boiler and cook 2 minutes longer. Add butter and vanilla and cool. Turn into pie shell. Beat egg whites until foamy throughout; add sugar, 2 tablespoons at a time, beating after each addition until sugar is blended. Then continue beating until mixture will stand in peaks. Pie lightly on filling. Bake in hot oven (325° F.) 5 minutes. Sprinkle coconut on top. Then bake 2 minutes longer.

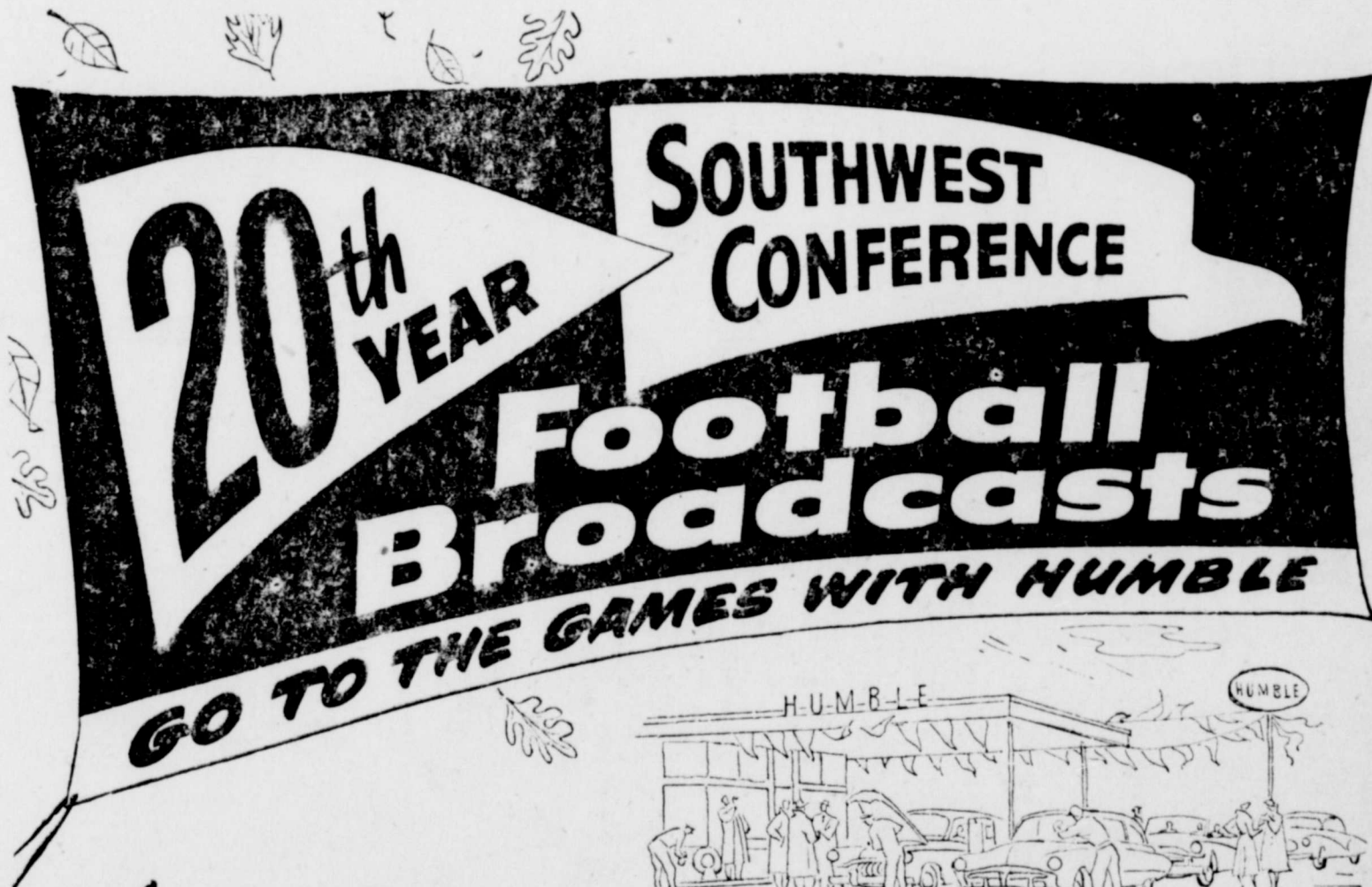

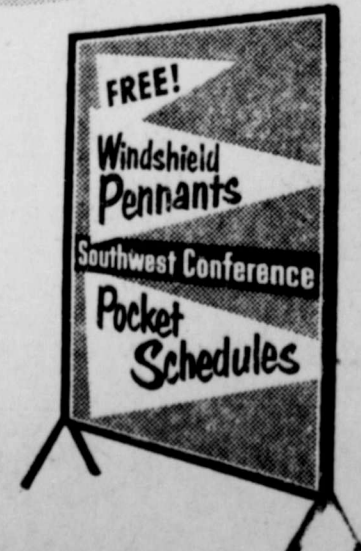
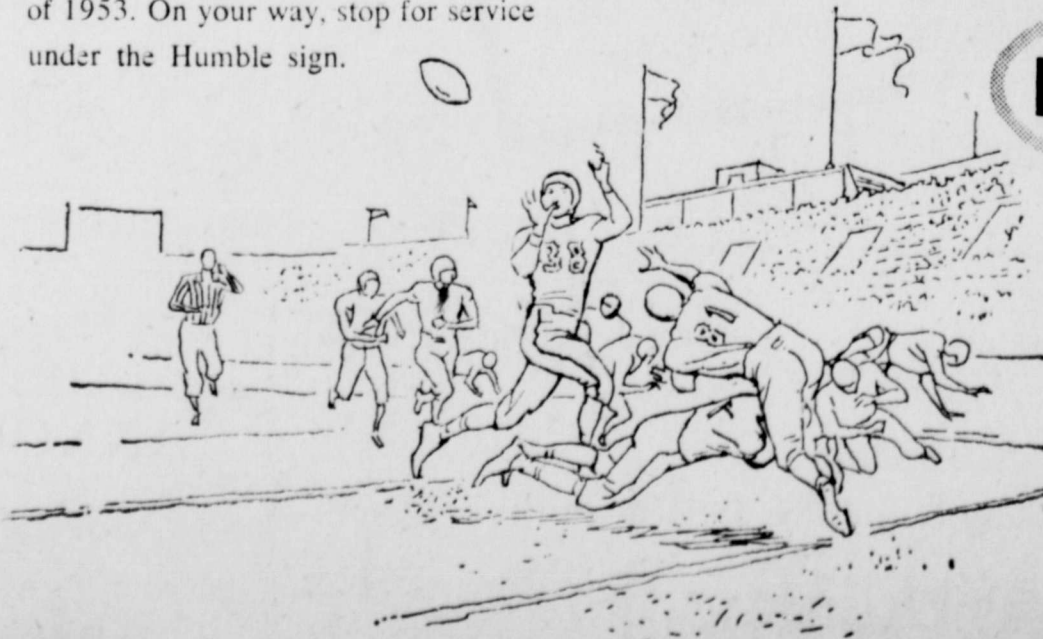

**Pimiento Strips Lace Veal Football Loaf**

It's football kick-off time, and here's a veal loaf that will be the star of any football party, whether it's for the youngster's gang or your own friends. Shape the meat like a football and "lace it up" with gay strips of red pimiento. This main dish is just as pretty when it's cut, because hard-cooked eggs and pimiento rolls are placed so they will show in every slice. Note: You can also press this loaf into a regular loaf pan or into any other shape you might wish.

**Pimiento Veal Loaf**

- 2 pounds veal, ground
- 1/2 pound pork, ground
- 1/2 green pepper, chopped
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup fresh bread crumbs, packed
- 1 egg
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 6 strips bacon
- 3 hard-cooked eggs
- 1 4-oz. can or jar of pimiento

Mix all ingredients except bacon, hard-cooked eggs, and pimiento. Divide the mixture in half and press one half into baking dish in the shape of a football. Press a hollow down the center and place eggs in it, end to end. Make rolls of pimiento and place on each side of the eggs. Now place remainder of meat mixture over this and finish patting into a football shape. Place strips of bacon over top. Cover and bake 40 minutes at 300 degrees F. Remove cover and bake 30 minutes longer. Garnish with pimiento lacings on football. Serves six. Serve with:

**Pimiento Mushroom Sauce**

Heat 1 can condensed mushroom soup, 1/2 cup milk, and 2 whole pimientos chopped into bits. Season to taste and serve in hot sauce.

### THE BENNY GREENS Win Second in Home Improvement Contest In Arkansas

Mr. and Mrs. Benny G. Green of near Evreton, won second place in seventeen northwest Arkansas counties after entering a contest for home improvement, sponsored by the Farmers Home Administration, Agricultural Extension Service, Arkansas P. & S. Association and the Arkansas Power and Light Company. This honor was in recognition of their efforts on their kitchen.

Mr. Green is an excellent cabinet maker and the cabinets are almost perfect in construction. The surface of the cabinets were made by ripping good pine lumber into one inch strips. The strips were then glued together, dressed, sanded and covered with several coats of clear varnish. Mr. Green states that this sort of construction will never give, warp or sag regardless of the years of service.

Mr. and Mrs. Green and son, Rickey, came to Arkansas in September, 1951 from West Texas. They purchased a 220 acre farm from W. O. Kiener known as Duggars Stand near Evreton. In 1952 they secured a farm Housing Loan through the local office of the Farmers Home Administration to remodel the old house on their place making it modern in every way. They used a spring for their water supply. This spring comes out of the bluff east of the house high enough to afford gravity water pressure to throw water above the house roof.

The Greens are milking fourteen good dairy cows and run a small herd of fifteen Hereford beef cows.

Mr. Green is a World War II veteran and served in the 944 Guard Squadron of the Air Force. He was discharged January 19, 1944.

Mrs. Green is an excellent housekeeper as well as a number one farm hand. Rickey will attend his first term of school next year.
