The pudding, made in a jiffy, gives that real lemon flavor to the frosting and when combined with the other ingredients listed below provides a fluffy golden topping for an angel cake.



#### Lemon Angel Cake

1 package lemon pudding and pie filling mix; 1½ cups water; 1 egg; ¼ cup butter; 1½ cups sifted confectioners' sugar; 10-inch angel food cake.

Combine pudding mix and ¼ cup of water in saucepan. Add whole egg and blend well. Then add remaining 1¼ cups water. Cook and stir until mixture comes to a full boil and is thickened. (This takes about 5 minutes.) Remove from heat. Cool about 5 minutes; stir once or twice. Chill.

Cream butter until soft. Add sugar gradually, blending well after each addition. Add chilled pudding gradually, beating well with rotary egg beater.

Split cake into three layers. Spread frosting between layers and on top and sides of cake. Makes 10 to 12 servings.



A record number of entries is expected to compete for \$20,000 in premiums at the San Angelo Fat Stock Show February 25-28. Championship Hereford, Angus and Brangus cattle; Rambouillet, Delaine, Corriedale, Suffolk, Hampshire, South-Down, Shropshire sheep; fat steers and lambs will be shown in new barns at the Fairgrounds.

Equally important during the 4-day Stock Show will be the Championship Rodeo at 2:00 p.m. daily. Produced by Everett Colburn of Dublin, Texas the rodeo is described by officials as the "toughest, toughest and wildest" in the southwest. **Now in Texas Hospital Association**

The Sterling County Hospital has just received notice that it has been accepted as an Active Institutional Member of the Texas Hospital Association, the activities and programs of which are directed specifically toward "better health for Texans."

The requirements for membership in the Association are that a hospital be registered by the American Medical Association and that the doctors practicing there be members of or eligible for membership in their county medical society.

Being a member of the Texas Hospital Association is beneficial to an institution because it indicates to a community that its hospitals are qualified and ethical, and are meeting the high standards of good hospitalization. This adds prestige to an institution and creates confidence.

Membership affords opportunities for improvement of member hospitals by frequent contacts with other hospitals in the Association concerning procedures and practices. It also offers a means of joining with other Texas hospitals in any advancement of their interests.

Legal counsel in Austin is provided for member hospitals to watch for any legislation that would affect hospitals, and makes legal advice on matters of legislative nature available to members of the association through its counsel.

The Association sponsors such organizations as Group Hospital Service, Inc., and Group Medical and Surgical Service to furnish hospitalization for employed people at cost. It places statistical information on Texas hospitals at the disposal of its members through extensive studies and surveys. The Association's official monthly publication, Texas Hospitals, keeps its members up to date on developments in the field through presentation of educational articles and news reports.

Membership means an opportunity to attend large conventions each year where hundreds of hospital personnel meet to keep abreast with developments and to plan programs for the improvement of all institutions.
