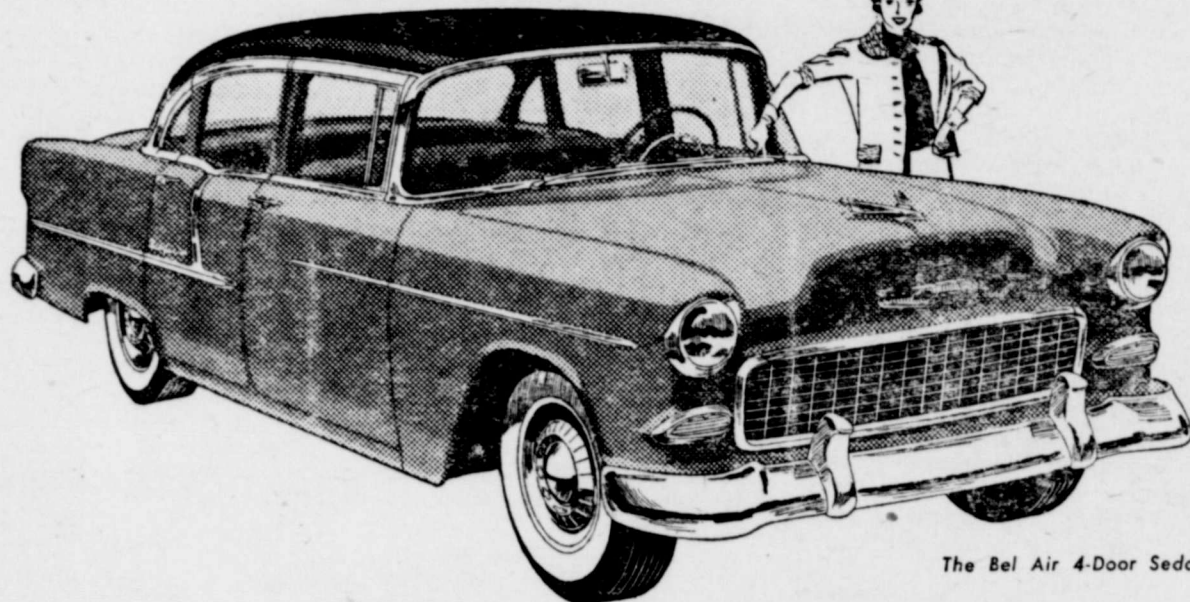

If you're the refreshment committee, have plenty of milk and instant cocoa mix on hand for easy-to-mix Chocolate Milks. #### Cold Chocolate Milk

1 glass cold milk; 2 to 3 heaping teaspoons instant cocoa mix.

Pour milk into a tall glass. Add cocoa mix and stir well. Or shake in shaker. Makes 1 serving.

Note: Dash of salt may be added with the cocoa mix, if desired.

Chocolate Cola. Use recipe for Cold Chocolate Milk, substituting 1 cup cola-flavored beverage for the milk.

Spicy Chocolate Milk. Use recipe for Cold Chocolate Milk, adding dash of ground cloves and dash of cinnamon to the milk.

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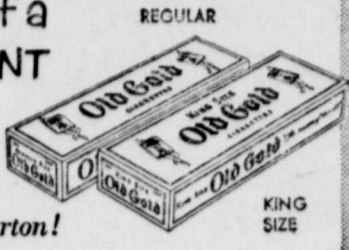

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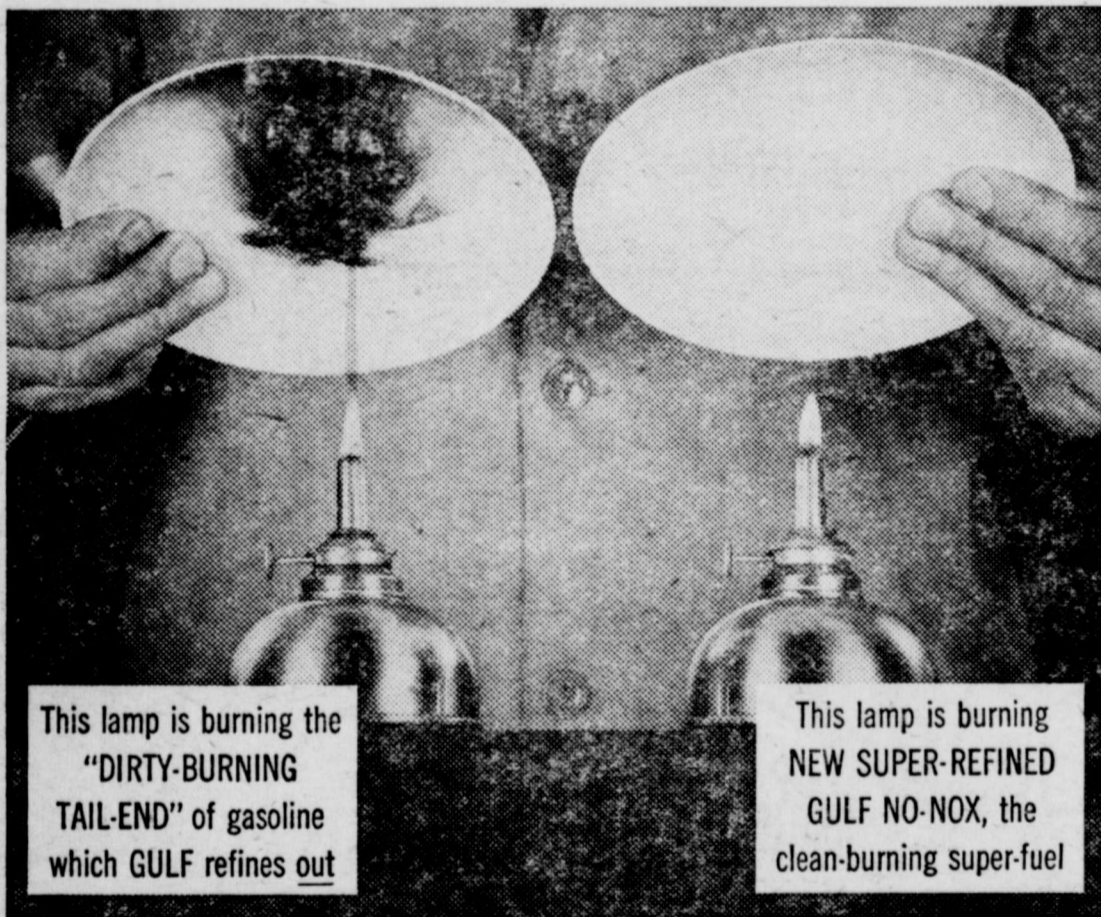

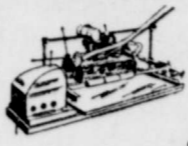
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**New Almanacs at News-Record.**

ON a rainy summer day little  
girls get restless with no-  
where to go, not even school. This  
gives their  
mothers the  
chance to teach  
them the proper  
way to prepare  
a batch of fudge.  
After all, each  
girl should ac-  
quire the know-  
how of fudge  
making before  
she reaches the stage of entertain-  
ing the boy-next-door!

**Reliance Fudge**  
2 squares unsweetened chocolate;  
¾ cup milk; 2 cups sugar; 1 table-  
spoon light corn syrup; dash of  
salt; 2 tablespoons butter or mar-  
garine; 1 teaspoon vanilla.

Add chocolate to milk and place  
over low heat. Cook until mixture  
is smooth and blended, stirring con-  
stantly. Add sugar, corn syrup and  
salt, and stir until sugar is dis-  
solved and mixture boils. Continue  
boiling, without stirring, until a  
small amount of mixture forms a  
very soft ball in cold water (or to a  
temperature of 232° F.). Remove  
from heat. Add butter and vanilla.  
Cool to lukewarm (110° F.); then  
beat until mixture begins to thicken  
and loses its gloss. Turn at once  
into greased 8 x 4-inch pan. When  
cold, cut into squares. Makes 14  
large pieces.

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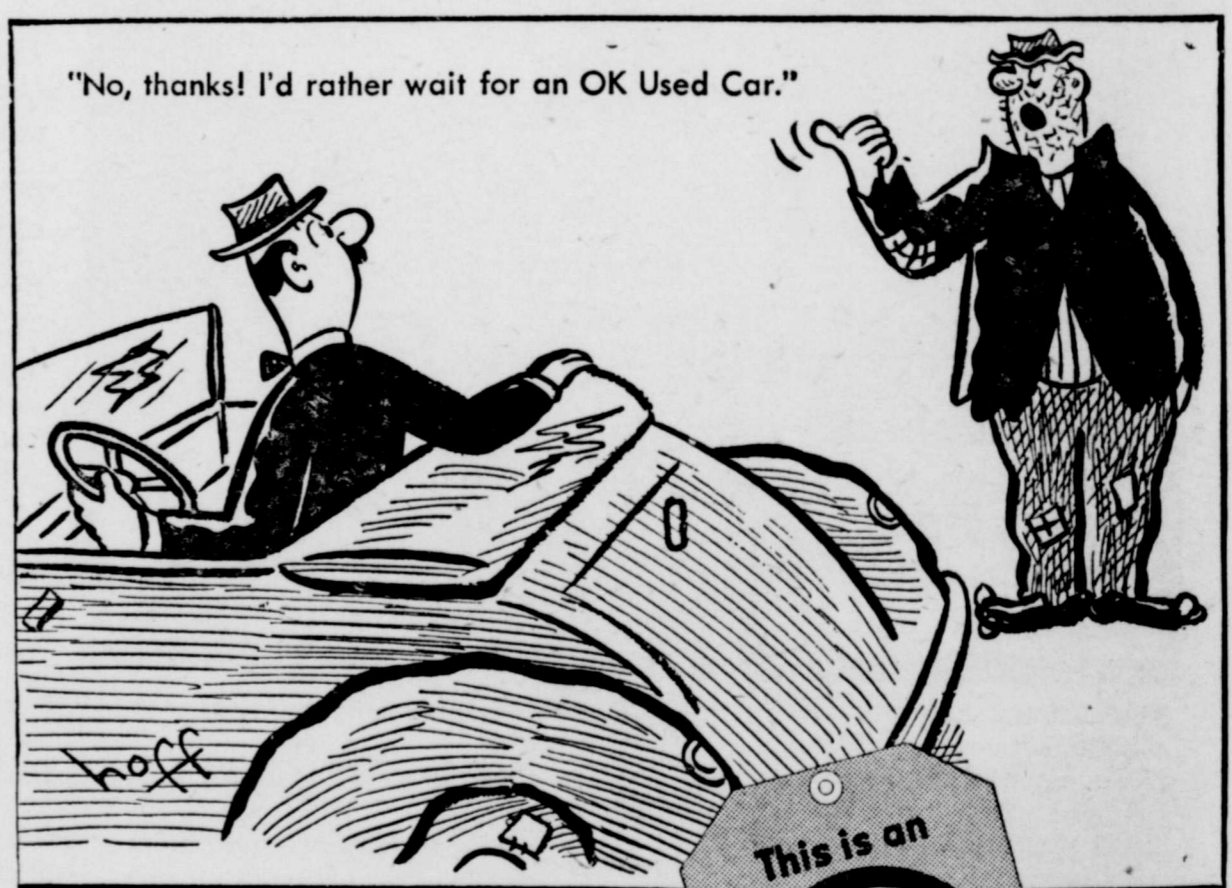
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
