LuBBOCK--Some species have been sold out, but
it is not too late for West Texans to purchase several Texans to purchase severa
varieties of windbreak tree seedlings from the Texas The Service's West Tex as Nursery in Lubbock still has two varieties of coni fers and five types of hard wood seedlings available for the $1981-82$ planting
season, which season,
March.
According to Bob Fewin silviculturist at Lubbock, the conifer species still
available are Austria and ponderosa pine. Thes 6 to 12 -inch pinc seedling are grown in individual Styrofoam, 30 cells to Styrofoam containe minimum order is 30 ,
priced at $\$ 30$ per priced at $\$ 30$ per containe sold by the container, or multiples of 30 . The containers are 12 inches wide by 14 inches long, by 8 inches deep, and several containers can easily be transported in the back seat of a car or pickup cab. The hardwood seedling species still available in
clude: green ash, honey locust, bur oak, mulberry and Russian Olive. The hardwoods are sold in
minimum lots of 100 for 20 (plus sales
shipping costs).
