In the Yearling ewe class, Clinton placed second and seventh, while Fred placed sixth and eighth.

Clinton won top spot in the Pen of Three Yearling Ewes and Fred nabbed the second place ribbon.

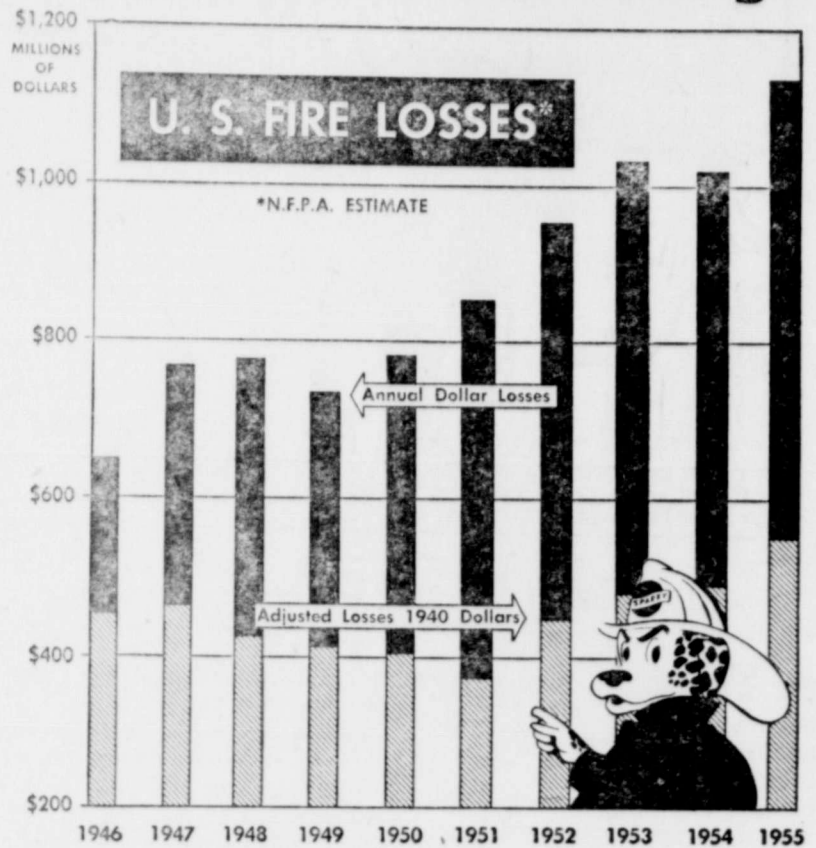
In the Ewe Lamb Class, Fred got third and fourth spots while Clinton took fifth and eighth.

Fire Losses At Record High



The United States in 1955 experienced its worst "fire" year in history, reports the National Fire Protection Association. Fire last year cost the country \$1,140,768,000 in direct loss, the international fire safety group estimated. This was nearly \$120,000,000 more than the previous record high in 1953. A very large increase in the number of building fires plus substantially increased industrial, forest and aircraft fire losses have contributed to the huge overall increase, according to the NFPA.

This latest sharp rise in fire losses continues the upward trend of recent years as shown in the graph above. Apparently 1954 was only a temporary deflection of that trend.

Here's a fable for Fire Prevention Week:

FITCHBURG, MASSACHUSETTS—Fire snuffed out the lives of 11,475 men, women and children here and severely burned or disfigured for life 30,000 others. Total population is 43,000.

No, it didn't happen in Fitchburg, Mass., or in any other city or town in the United States—not at once.

But it did happen in these United States last year—in cities, towns, villages and hamlets from the Atlantic to the Pacific, from the Rio Grande to the Canadian border; in a 12-month period.

The figures are correct—11,475 dead by fires, 30,000 more injured; 31 dead by fires every day. These are National Fire Protection Association estimates.

Speculate on the possibility of a city of 43,000 being swept by fire, suffering 12,000 deaths, 30,000 injuries. A horrible catastrophe.

Is it any worse if the 12,000 needless deaths are spread over 365 days? Do 31 fatalities per day by fire lessen the shock and the waste?

One death by fire is one too many.

Seal Assures Top Quality Of Windows

The prospective home-buyer who wants to be sure that the house he's considering has top-quality wood windows can follow the advice given by window manufacturers' representatives to the Federal Housing Administration. This is to look for the seal of approval of the American Wood Window Institute affixed to each window frame.

At a series of meetings held for officials of 70 regional FHA offices, it was explained that the AWUI seal "makes it possible to be sure at a glance that high standards of workmanship have been met or exceeded," according to Practical Builder magazine.

The seal certifies that the window has been made according to a Commercial Standard of the U.S. Department of Commerce. It is now being applied only to double-hung windows, but plans are being made to extend the certification to awning, sliding, and casement windows as soon as appropriate standards have been prepared.

FHA's interest in the seal lies in the fact that the agency has the power to grant a higher mortgage insurance commitment when a house is built with materials that exceed minimum FHA requirements.

Practical Builder explains that the seal assures a purchaser that the window has been made of properly dried lumber, that it is satisfactorily weather-stripped, that it has been treated with a water-repellent chemical, that the sash operate easily, and that the frame is accurately machined and free of defects.

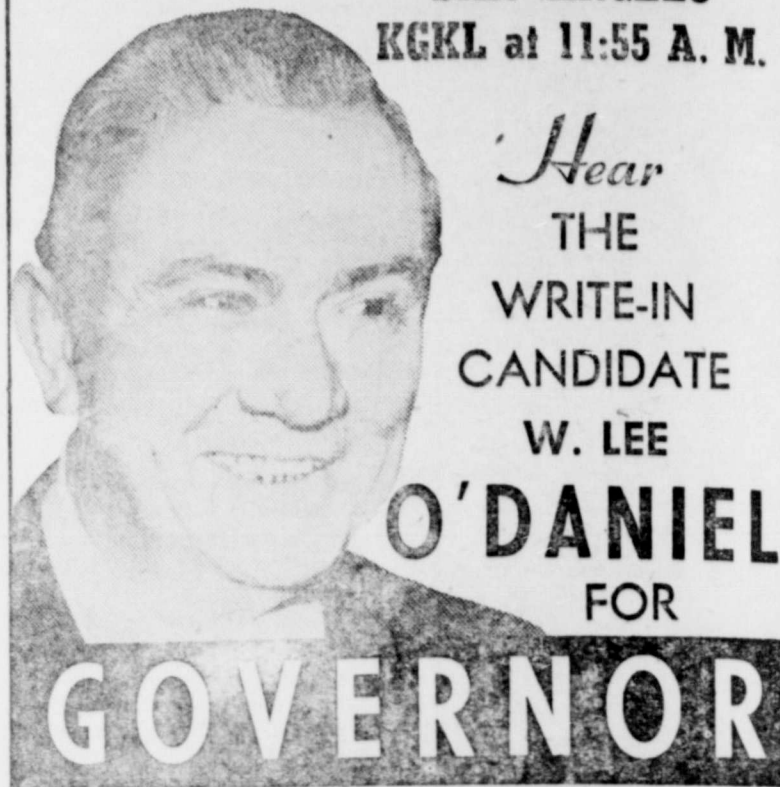

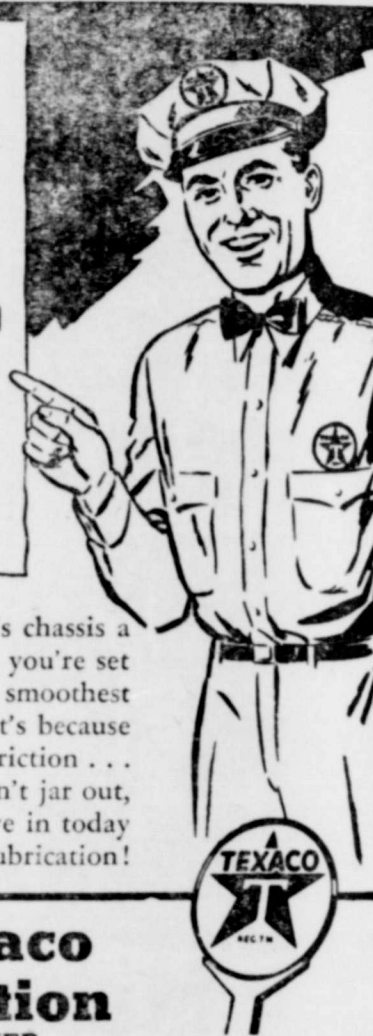

Completes Three Day Field Trip

10th DIV., GERMANY—Pfc Pascal A. Brown, whose wife, Clela, and parents, Mr. and Mrs. Ted Brown, live in Sterling City, recently completed a three-day field artillery battery test with the 10th Infantry Division in—Germany.

Brown, a radio operator in Headquarters Battery of the division's 35th Field Artillery Battalion, entered the Army in December 1954 and completed basic training at Ft. Riley, Kansas.

A 1951 graduate of Sterling City

High School, Brown was employed by the Texas Electric Service Company in Big Spring, before entering the Army.

HOME OWNERS QUESTION BOX

Q—What causes a carbide-tipped drill bit to stick when I drill holes in masonry?

A—Usually it's a small chunk of aggregate, or gravel, mixed into the masonry. A star drill usually will powder the aggregate and you can continue drilling with the carbide bit.

Q—Approximately how much should it cost a year to air condition an average-size house?

A—This depends on a large number of variable factors, including size and design of the house, but tests made in the Air Conditioned Village, Austin, Tex., give some good indications. Here a Coleman-equipped house, 1,300 square feet in size, was cooled during a hot Texas summer at an average cost of 70 cents per day. Sixty-eight cents of this went for electricity, while water cost less than two cents a day. The equipment is of a water-conserving type.

Q—We just bought a new home with a beautiful fireplace. But we can't build a fire in it because smoke soon fills the entire house. The chimney isn't clogged and extends well above the roof. What's wrong?

A—This is a common complaint from owners of small, tightly built homes. Try opening a window a few inches next time to start a draft.

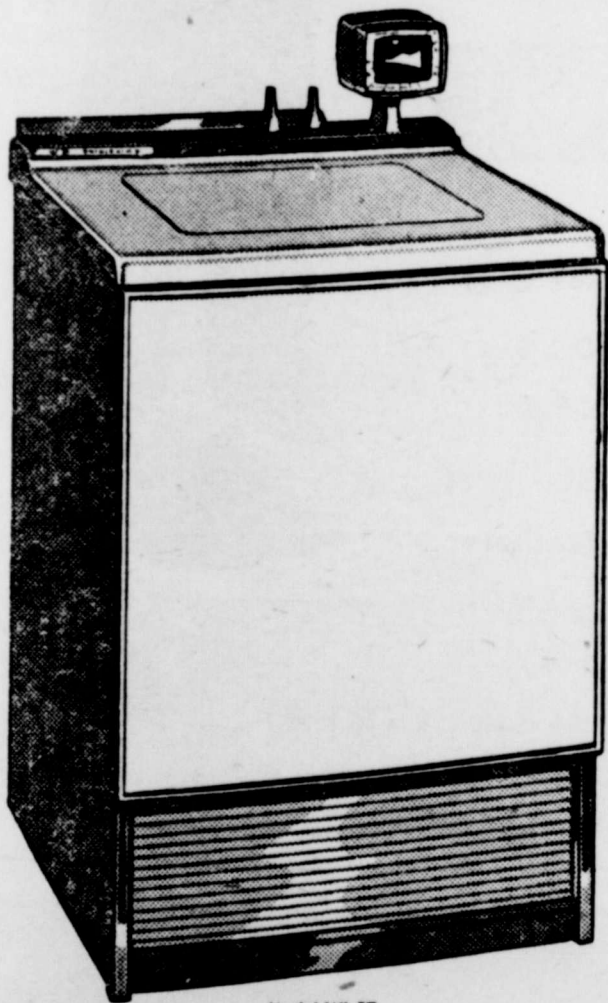

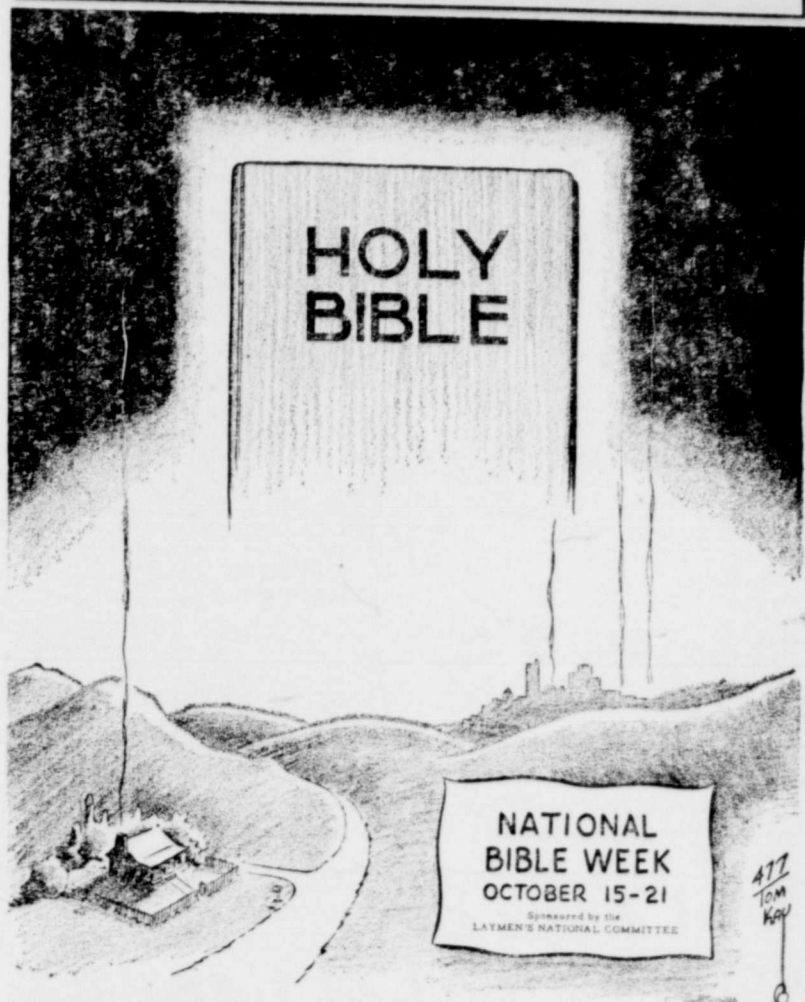

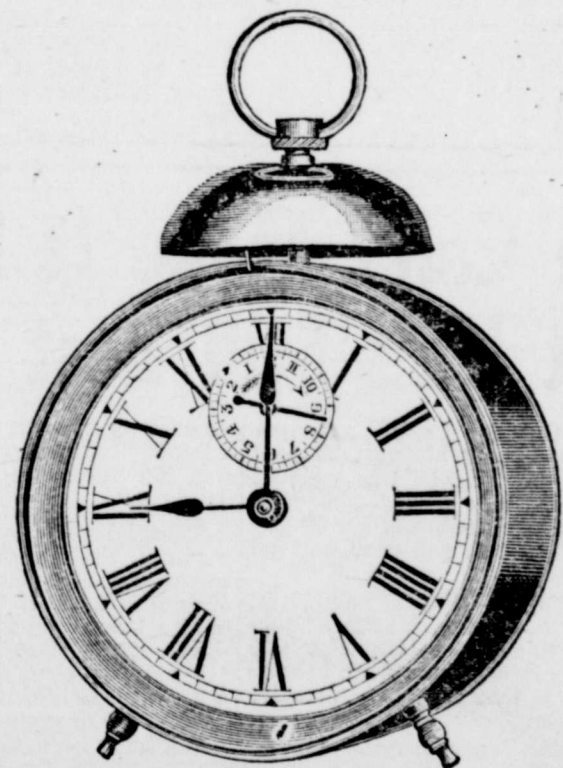

**Need More Living Space?
Fix Up Attached Garage**

Owners of small homes with attached garages are catching on to one of the neatest tricks yet devised to gain more living space at a minimum of cost.

Acting on the theory that the family deserves more consideration than the family car, they're turning their one- and two-car garages into bedrooms, larger kitchens, playrooms—anything that fills their needs or suits their fancy.

And the cash savings are big because the new-found living space already has a roof, concrete floor, and three framed walls.

The home handyman-and-wife team can do much of the work themselves on this project. They can install insulation, put down tile floors, and do interior finishing.

Batts and blankets of mineral wool insulation, because of their lightness and ease of handling, are a favorite installation project for the husband-and-wife team. Only a few ordinary tools are needed, and when the job is done, the family knows its new living space will be easier to heat in winter and will stay cooler in summer.

Thick mineral wool is virtually essential to comfort in a room converted from a garage. The reason is that three walls and the roof of an attached garage normally are exterior surfaces, directly exposed to outdoor temperatures.

A contractor should be called in to handle major carpentry and supervise plumbing and heating installations.

Chances are he'll recommend filling all or part of the garage door opening with windows of ponderosa pine to get away from a "blank" appearance at the front of the house, and for

light and ventilation. Other windows are necessary, too—perhaps a widow wall at the rear overlooking your garden, perhaps one or more windows at the side.

It is economical to replace a garage door with a large grouping of windows, for little new wall framing, sheathing, and siding need be added when that is done. Ponderosa pine window units are available in a wide range of stock sizes to fit openings of various dimensions.

**Ike Can't Make It Rain,
But He's Still Best Man**

The other day I asked a farmer if it was dry out his way. He said it sure was. "Looks like we just can't get any rain," he said. "Why, when Noah had his 40-day flood, we didn't get over half an inch."

There's no mistake about it, Texas is having itself a real drouth. Some of the farmers and ranchers in our county are in such bad shape that they may vote for Stevenson.

Old Man Jones, from across the river, said he wasn't going to go to any such extreme. He said he needed rain as bad as anybody else. He claimed water was so scarce in his community that the preacher was baptizing new members with a wet handkerchief. But he was holding out awhile longer, anyway.

"I may be stubborn," said Old Man Jones, "but I just ain't been convinced that President Eisenhower is keeping it from raining."

He said he knew that Stevenson and Kefauver acted like they thought so, and they had a right to their opinion. Lyndon Johnson, he figured, knew better, but he was sticking with Adlai and Estes for the sake of unity. He said he didn't figure Mr. Sam Rayburn had known whether it was raining or not for the last 25 years.

"I hate not to go along with such a widely known crowd of weather observers," Old Man Jones said. "If there's anybody

who keeps up with which way the wind is blowing, generally speaking, it's Stevenson, Kefauver and Johnson."

Then he went on to say that he realized the national farm program hadn't pleased everybody—including him. If he was in the White House, he would do things different, at least in our county. He allowed that the \$61,000,000 spent by the Eisenhower administration for drought relief in Texas could have been doubled and still not made all the farmers happy and prosperous.

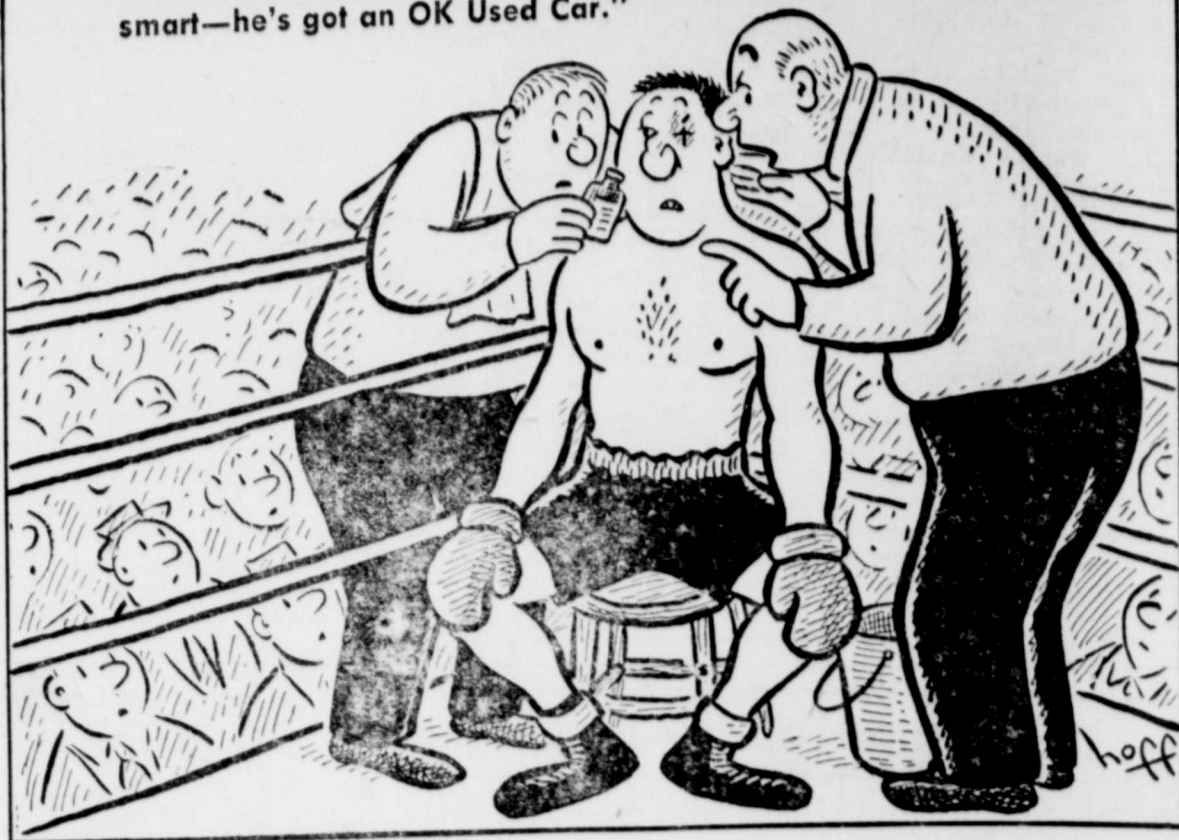
"But," said Old Man Jones, "I keep remembering that the main reason for our troubles, besides the drouth, is the fact that we are not at war. Now, if Adlai and Estes really want to jump on President Eisenhower, there is a real issue. They've sure got the goods on Ike in that respect. If he hadn't stopped that Korean War, farm prices would be higher, no doubt. I wonder why they never mention that."

Old Man Jones was kidding a little, of course, in his usual way, but I think he had something there. We have got to adjust to peace-time, which is taking awhile but President Eisenhower is working at it. And meanwhile our boys aren't fighting and dying on foreign soil. It's worth thinking about.

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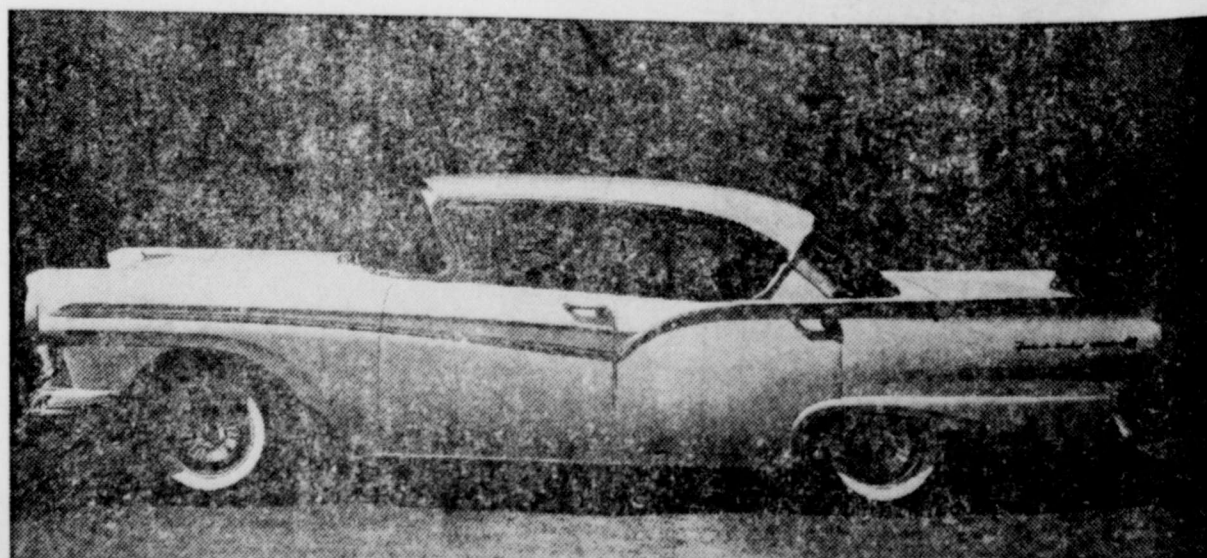
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From the road up, 1957 Fords are a complete departure from previous models.
