Times do change! A few years ago no busy young homemaker would dream of taking time out from a busy morning for a little chit chat with her neighbor over a cup of coffee. Now, however, a late morning kaffeeklatch with a few hands of bridge thrown in is a growing custom in small towns and cities. "Helps us relax," say these busy young homemakers.
