

The rice is blended with a tomato sauce, green peppers, onion and spices and then sprinkled with crumbled bacon. You'll want to serve this Spanish-type dish often . . . but especially on busy days.

Bacon Spanish Rice Pronto 1/4 cup bacon drippings or 1-1/2 cups hot water

butter


1 medium onion, thinly sliced (about 1/2 cup)

1/2 medium green pepper, diced (about 1/3 cup) 1-1/3 cups (4-5/8-ounce box) packaged pre-cooked rice

2 cans (8 ounces each) tomato sauce

1 teaspoon salt Dash of pepper 1/2 teaspoon prepared mustard (optional) 8 strips bacon, crisp

fried and crumbled Melt fat in saucepan or skillet. Add onion, green pepper, and rice. Cook and stir over high heat until lightly browned. Add remaining ingredients except bacon. Mix well. Bring quickly to a boil, reduce heat, and simmer, uncovered, for 5 minutes. Sprinkle with bacon before serving. Makes 4 servings.


