Control measures for grasshoppers consist of either spraying or the use of poison baits. While the hoppers are small a spray works very well but when they reach maturity it may be necessary to resort to the bait measure. Toxaphene, chlordane, lindane, aldrin, heptachlor may be used as a spray. Toxaphene, chlordane and lindane usually are the easiest of the recommended materials to obtain.
