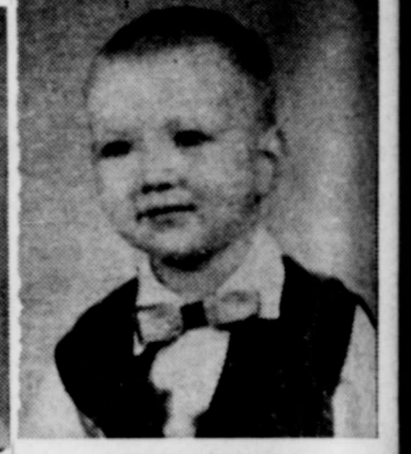

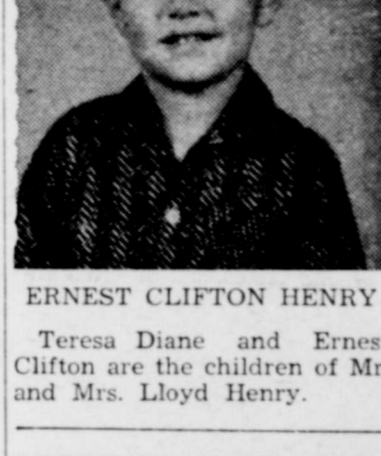

**OUTDOOR COOKING MADE EASY**

Since we wrote in this column about the "stovepipe stove" (as described in the booklet mentioned below), other similar outdoor cooking ideas have been sent in by readers. A good one — especially for windy places — is the "tin can stove", which looks like this:



The can, of course, is a large and clean one with the top removed. With metal shears and a beer can opener, cut upper and lower vents as shown, and the stove is ready for use. Build a small fire and invert the can over it, because the can's bottom is the top on which we cook. The fire is fed with small, dry sticks added either through the bottom or the top vents. With a little practice, any degree of cooking heat can be obtained, merely by adding twigs or dry sticks, as needed.

We tried this stove while ice fishing, and rested it on a flat rock we had pushed out on the ice. The harder the wind blows, the better it seems to work, and it's an excellent arrangement for warming cold hands. A stone placed against the lower vent to partially plug it up acts as a damper, forcing the fire to burn slower and for a longer time.

First we fry bacon or sausage on the top to "grease the skillet". Then we make pancakes, each of which can be as big as the stove-top. To some regular pancake mix we add an egg (if we have it) and a little of the bacon or sausage fat — plus enough milk or water to make a batter. We make chocolate or coffee or mocha pancakes instead of using syrup. To do this, merely stir three or four tablespoons of "EverReady" cocoa, or one tablespoon of "Nescafe" and one of sugar per cup of flour into the mix. If we use both "Nescafe" and "EverReady", we get mocha cakes, which are exceptionally good.

Of course this stove will cook bacon and eggs, hamburgs and many other "short order" dishes. It makes good toast, too, and is a good way to grille sandwiches. The food can be

carried in the can, so everything is in a compact container.

When the stove is not being used for cooking, keep a pot of water heating on it. This one pot of water provides a choice of several instant drinks, such as "Nescafe" instant coffee, "Nestea" instant tea, and "EverReady" cocoa. Just pour very hot water over the powder in a cup, and the steaming beverage is ready to drink. "After all", one fisherman said, "there are no grounds for waiting!"

The "energy bar" recipe brought lots of mail, too. This pocket sportsman's snack is described in the booklet mentioned below, so we won't repeat it here. One of the better recipes sent in, from the outdoorsman's point of view, is for "Mocha Peanut Clusters". We tried this at home and had to make a second batch to take while fishing, because the family consumed the first one.

To make "Mocha Peanut Clusters", merely put a 6 oz. package of "Nestle's" Semi-Sweet Chocolate pieces into a double boiler and add a third of a cup (2/3 stick) of butter or margarine. Keep stirring, and when this is melted and smooth, add a tablespoon of "Nescafe" instant coffee. Mix well; remove from heat, and stir in two cups of salted peanuts. Drop the mixture from a teaspoon onto waxed paper.

Both the "energy bar" and the "peanut cluster" recipes are good ones for outdoorsmen because they contain a lot of protein and chocolate — both valuable energy builders for folks who enjoy exercise. Wrap them in foil and carry them in your fishing or hunting coat, so you'll have a tasty, energy-building snack when you want one.

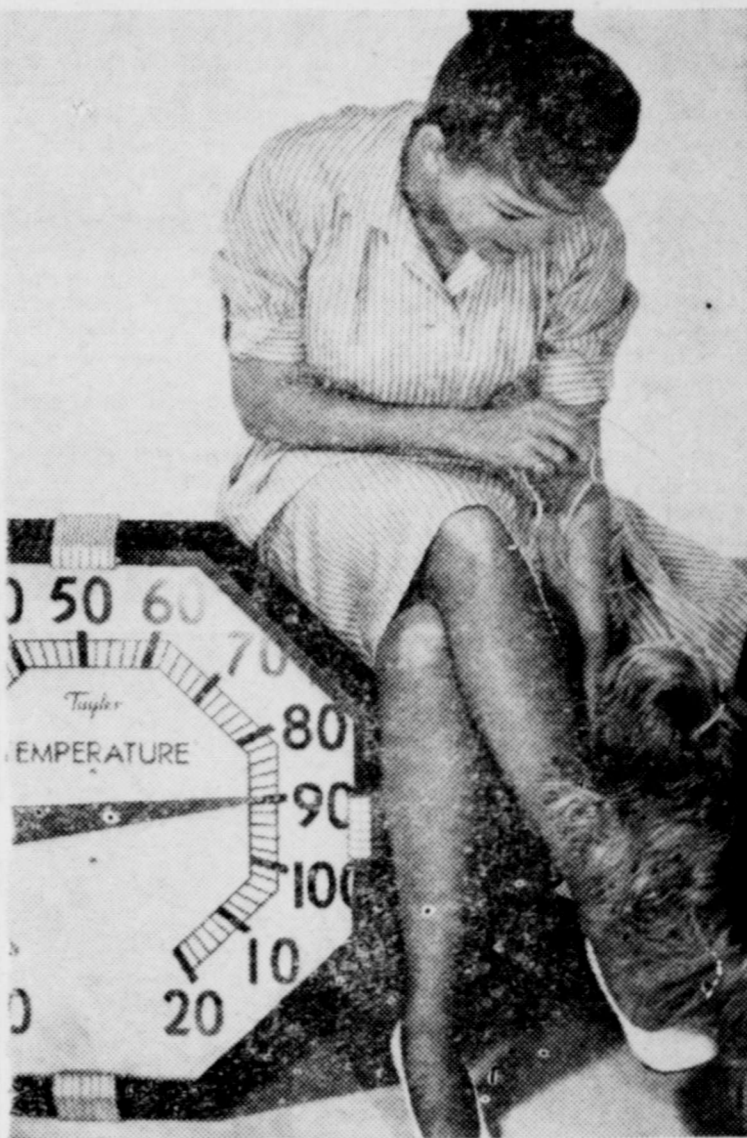
