



"Our new action program, 'Strengthening the home, source of our nation's greatness,'" will be launched at the National Congress convention in May.



#### VACATION TIME IS FRIED CHICKEN TIME



By JANE ASHLEY

Has fried chicken become the national summer vacation dish? Many Americans will tell you so, and you'll find many ways to fry chicken in case you want to make a survey. Whether you coat the chicken in batter, crumbs, cr flour most cooks agree that a refined vegetable oil such as Mazola corn oil is essential for perfectly fried chicken. The chicken should be crisp, golden brown in color, bland in flavor, well cooked inside and the surface free from excess fat.

Home Style Fried Chicken

Cut broiler fryer chicken (21/2) Season flour for coating with salt and pepper. Coat chicken pieces lightly and evenly with seasoned flour. Pour corn oil to a depth of ½ inch in fry pan. As a guide use about ½ cup in a 10-inch fry pan and ½ cup in a 12-inch skillet. Preheat oil over medium heat before adding chicken. Correct frying temto 3 lbs.) into serving pieces.

chicken. Correct frying temperature is 375°F, and it takes about 8 to 10 minutes to preheat in the average weight fry pan. Fry chicken to a golden brown on the bottom side before turning. Use more corn oil if needed for the larger chicken. Turn and continue cooking, turning the fry pan to make about 13 cup. Add about 14 cup of the seasoned flour from the coating for the chicken. Blend well with browned particles in fry pan. Add 3 cups milk slowly, stirring constantly. Bring to a boil and boil about 2 minutes. Add more salt and pepper, if needed. Makes 4 to 5 servings.
