

2 egg whites; 1½ cups sugar; ½ teaspoon salt; ½ cup water; 2 tablespoons light corn syrup; 2 tablespoons honey; 1/2 teaspoon vanilla; % cup Angel Flake Coconut.

Combine egg whites, sugar, salt, water, corn syrup, and honey in top of double boiler. Beat 1 minute until thoroughly mixed.
