# STERLING SCHOOL J. S. COLE, 88, DIES FRIDAY 2:30 P. M.

J. S. Cole, 88, honorary vicepresident of the First National Bank here, died in the Sterling County Hospital about 2:30 p.m. Friday. He had been Ill for about two weeks and was taken to the hispital Frilay morning at 11 a.m. by ambulance.

Born in Walker County, Alabama, the son of James and Harriet Cole, Mr. Cole came to Texas in October 1894. For two years he lived in Johnson County. He lived in Arizone in 1897-98 and came to Sterling County in July 1898.

Until 1900 he served as deputy in the County clerk's office here. In 1900 he was elected clerk and served that capacity through 1908. For two years he was an abstracter of Sterling County land titles 1909-1910)


