

MAGIC FRUIT CAKE IS READY FOR OVEN IN FIFTEEN MINUTES



By Betty Barclay

Here's a special cake that would bring renown to any hostess. thas all the eye appeal, all the richness and flavor, that characterize he finest fruit cakes. But it takes only fifteen minutes to prepare instead of the hours needed for the old-fashioned kind.

The time-saving secret is the use of sweetened condensed milk and condensed mince meat. They combine to give a rich, fruity oundation, in taste and texture, for this quick triumph.

It's an easy matter to decorate the top of a fruit cake. Almonds, pplied like petals around half a maraschino cherry, make an efective trim.

ective trim.

Magic Fruit Cake (Makes a 9 by 4 by 3 inch loaf) 1 9-oz. package condensed

2 cup water 1 cup walnut meats, coarsely

chopped
1 cup (8-oz.) mixed candied
fruit, coarsely chopped
1½ cups (15-oz. can) sweet-

ened condensed milk 1 egg, beaten % cup flour

heat and stir until all lumps are thoroughly broken. Boil briskly one minute, stirring constantly. Remove from heat and cool. Add nuts, candied fruit, sweetened condensed milk and egg; blend well. Stir in flour and baking soda until just blended. Pour mixture into a 9 by 4 by 3 inch loaf pan which has been greased, waxed paper lined and greased again. Bake in moderate oven (350° F.) 1 hour and 30 minutes or until 1 egg, beaten
% cup flour
½ teaspoon baking soda
Break mince meat into small pieces; place in 2-quart saucepan.
Add water. Place over medium

Bake in moderate oven (350° F.)
1 hour and 30 minutes or until center springs back when lightly touched with finger, and top is golden brown. If glass type baking dish is used, reduce oven heat to 325°F.

### TAX FACTS FOR THE HOMEOWNER NO. 3" The Home As An Income Producer

(This is one of a series of articles on federal income tax Aling. The articles are based on information provided by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and the Texas Society of Certified Public Accountants, in cooperation with the Internal Revenue Service.)

IF YOU rent all or part of your home, the income you receive is taxable. However, the government is only CARD OF THANKS interested in taxing the amount you gain over and above your expense for maintaining the lodging. You can save valuable tax dollars by being aware of the expenses you can deduct from the rent you receive.

Assume that you own an eight room house. Since you only need six rooms, you decide to rent the other two rooms as a furnished apartment. You will now have two kinds of deductible expenses, those expenses that apply to the house as a unit, and those ex-penses that apply particularly to the apartment.

As a home owner, you can deduct any property taxes you may have to pay. You can also deduct the interest on a mortsage. This is true whether you rent part of the house or not, but as legitimate busines expendi-there are some additional de-ductions you can take from the heat, light, insurance and so on rent you receive for the two items as insurance, repairs, collection fees, depreciation, and If you happen to be renting brokerage commissions. 
